PRICES SOAR TWO CENTS NEAR LAST

CHICAGO, March 10.—(AP)—Silver action in congress today had magical results on the wheat market, shooting prices skyward 2c a bushel before speculators could catch their breath.

Pluried buying that whirled the wheat trade into buoyancy came just before the final hour of grain business and followed bulletins from Washington saying the house coinage committee had voted favorably on a bill to exchange exports of agricultural products for silver.
