

HOUSE UPHOLDS VETERANS BILL

000,000 of continuing expenditures for which congress had failed to provide by additional taxation. He added that service connected disability of former soldiers was a matter of fact and not one of law and that boards had already been set up to determine the justice of the claims of numerous veterans who prior to the enactment of the economy act had been presumed to have been injured in the service.

The local boards, he said, had disallowed 28,000 claims, unanimously in 94 per cent of the cases. Pending review of these cases by appeal boards, Mr. Roosevelt said he would direct that the veterans affected by these disallowances be given 75 per cent of their former compensation. If the appeal is allowed, they will receive full compensation again; if rejected, they will be removed from the rolls.

Under existing regulations, however, he added, those permanently and totally disabled whose claims were disallowed still would receive \$30 a month, domiciliary care and hospitalization.

Mr. Roosevelt said another provision of the bill which would grant service pensions to Spanish-American war veterans, if later applied to world war veterans would put an annual and continuing charge upon the treasury of more than \$330,000,000.

"However," he said, "I am today directing the restoration to the rolls of those Spanish-American war veterans who in 1920 were receiving pensions as a result of having sustained an injury or incurred a disease arising out of their war service."

Would-be Beer Seller Sues to Regain License

FOREST GROVE, March 27.—(P)—A court battle will determine if beer shall be sold legally here. H. F. Giltner filed suit to regain his beer dispenser's license issued to him by the Oregon liquor control commission and revoked five days later.

The five days he sold beer is the only time in this city's history that sale of beer was legal.

George Neuner, attorney for the liquor commission, declared Giltner's license was canceled because it was not recommended by the city council and the county court. He intimated the citizens of Forest Grove were adverse to the sale of any liquor whatsoever.

After You, Rufus Burke Declares; Wants Harmony

PORTLAND, Ore., March 27.—(P)—State Senator W. E. Burke, one of the first to announce his candidacy for the republican nomination for governor, today said he will not be in the race for governor if State Treasurer Rufus C. Holman enters the race.

If Holman decides to enter the gubernatorial race Burke will seek to retain his Yamhill county seat in the senate.

"It is more important that the progressive vote be not divided than that I should be a candidate," he said.

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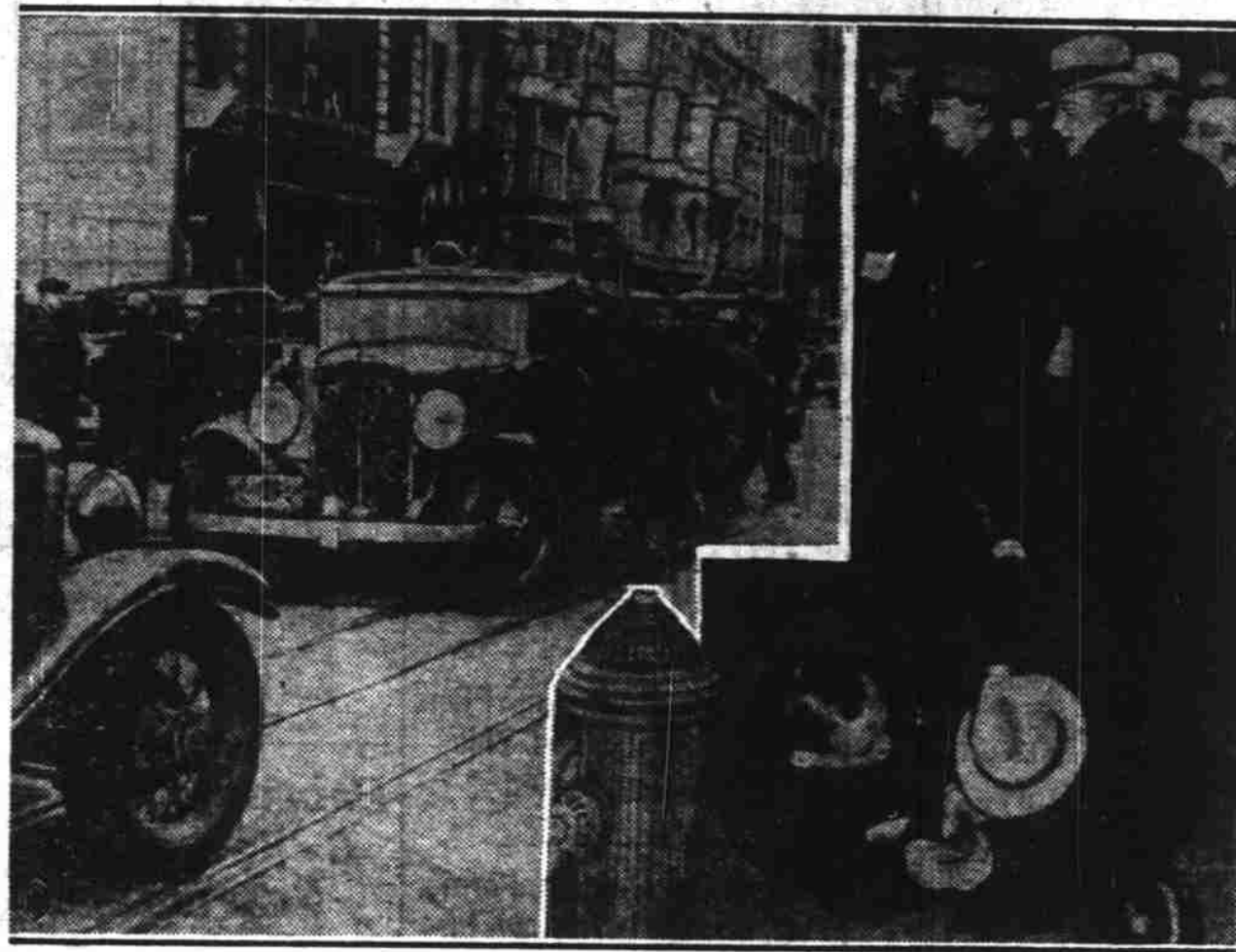
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Action on New York Taxi Front

Duplicate Moves Are Explained

Many questions have been asked of the writer concerning the proper movement for two tables of duplicate bridge. It adds greatly to the interest to have each player participate once with each other player. Below is a simple placement for such a movement:

First round:
Table I
No. 1 and 3 versus No. 7 and 2.
Table I
No. 4 and 3 versus No. 6 and 5.

At the end of each round the players change as follows:
No. 1 sits still and is the pivot.
No. 2 follows No. 3, No. 3 follows No. 4, No. 4 follows No. 5, No. 5 follows No. 6, No. 6 follows No. 7, No. 7 follows No. 8, No. 8 follows No. 2.

Each player is given a tally indicating where and with whom to play the first round.

Rules to Enforce
Even at a social bridge the following penalties should be enforced. These rules should be generally understood:

1. Revoke penalty. Revoking side must lose two tricks provided they are taken after the revoke is made.
2. Lead out of turn. Call the lead of a suit.
3. Bid out of turn. Bar partner of offender for one round of bidding.
4. Dummy cannot advise partner which hand to lead from. Cannot call a revoke.

NRA's labor advisory board and a professorship which he practices at Columbia.

The other two members of the automobile board were men active in the long discussions which led to forestalling a strike in that industry. Nicholas Kelley, attorney for the Chrysler corporation, and Richard L. Byrd, employee of General Motors at Pontiac, Mich. Kelley is the industry's representative; Byrd the workers'. The first meeting was set for tomorrow at Detroit.

The senate labor committee in its hearings on the Wagner labor board bill, today heard from a spokesman for the National Association of Manufacturers, James E. Emery, a suggestion that a tribunal of non-partisan character be set up to settle disputes. He proposed this as a substitute for the national labor board which the bill would equip with definite legal powers.

"Boards with arbitrary powers," Emery told the committee, "talk in terms of conflict and bitterness."

Ochoco District Refinancing Now Assured, Stated

Refinancing of the Ochoco irrigation district in Crook county virtually was assured yesterday when C. E. Stricklin, state engineer, received a telegram from San Francisco that the California bondholders' committee had accepted the offer of the Reconstructed Finance corporation to loan the district \$289,142, or approximately 20.28 cents on each dollar of its bond indebtedness.

Stricklin declared that approximately \$900,000 of bonds of the district already had been deposited in compliance with the refinancing program. The indebtedness of the district on June 30, 1933, aggregated \$2,612,726 including bonds, warrants and interest.

Under the terms of the federal loan the district was compelled to reduce its irritable area from 14,000 to 8500 acres.

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EK WALL CANDIDACY ORDERED ACCEPTED

The name of W. A. Ekwall, circuit judge of Multnomah county, will appear on the ballot at the primary election May 13 as a candidate for the republican nomination for the office of representative in congress from the third congressional district.

This was determined definitely yesterday when the state supreme court held that it was incumbent upon P. J. Stadelman, secretary of state, to file Ekwall's declaration of candidacy. Stadelman previously had refused to accept the declaration on the ground that Ekwall had signed an oath that he would not accept any other office, except judicial offices, during the term for which he was elected circuit judge.

"The constitution of the United States creates the office of representative and prescribes his qualifications," the supreme court opinion read. "By Article 1, Section 2, no person can be a representative until he has attained the age of 25 years and has been seven years a citizen of the United States and is at the time of his election an inhabitant of the state from which he is chosen."

BRAIN TRUST PROBE IS SOUGHT BY WIRT

GARY, Ind., March 27.—(P)—Dr. William A. Wirt wants a "full investigation or none" of his charges that unnamed "brain trusters" were planning a revolution and told him so.

He announced this as his position today while congressmen sought to decide what if anything to do about the "expose" made by the Gary school superintendent in his recent letter to James H. Rand, Jr.

By a "full investigation," Dr. Wirt said, he means something more than an investigation of what he told him and what he was told. He prefers an investigation of the entire new deal and said he thought it could be made by studying all the legislation passed up to date. As for giving names, Dr. Wirt said, "I'll be glad to go to Washington, particularly if they have a full, public investigation," he said.

Dr. Wirt from his home issued a call to civil and public leaders who have information concerning "machinations of the brain trust" to support him.

St. Paul's Night Classes End After Successful Term

SILVERTON, March 27.—St. Paul's night school which opened last November, closed after an exceptionally successful winter.

The total enrollment for the term reached 91 and classes offered included public speaking, commercial law, English, bookkeeping, shorthand, library science, civics and commercial arithmetic.

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TRAIN DERAILMENT CONFESSED, CLAIM

RAWLINS, Wyo., March 27.—(P)—A confession which they said revealed the derailment of a fast Union Pacific train here last Friday night was the man job of Horace G. Lovett, 54, was announced here tonight by officers working on the case.

Lovett confessed, the officers said, that robbery was the motive which caused him to loosen the rails and send the locomotive of the Portland Rose, crack transcontinental train, into the ditch.

Sheriff McPherson said the prisoner confessed that after the train was derailed he helped estrate Engineer B. W. Richmond who was buried in coal and debris but not seriously hurt. Foiled in his robbery attempt, Lovett said, he drove to Elk Mountain, Wyo., where he robbed a pool hall of \$4.50 in nickels.
