INSULL JOURNEY TO AMERICA IS BEGUN

ISTANBUL, April 12.—(AP)—Quietly and calmly, Samuel Insull started today the long trip to the United States where the fraud and bankruptcy charges he has evaded 18 months await him. The 74-year-old former utilities czar was taken under guard from the Istanbul house of detention to the steamer Adana

bound for Panderna. Later he will be taken by train to Smyrna and placed in the hands of British troops. Insull is expected to arrive in the United States aboard the S. S. Exilona, which sails Friday for America.

The Adana was scheduled to arrive at Panderna about midnight. Insull will be kept aboard until morning, when the trip to the Exilona will be made. Finally, the formal extradition will be made to Berry and he will begin the month-long journey to the United States.
