HEPBURN AGAIN ON ELSINORE SCREEN

In "Spitfire," Play Which Affords Real Chance to Show Ability

Critics have gone wild over Katharine Hepburn, 24 year old actress whose latest film, "Spitfire," is showing at the Elsinore now, but have found it difficult to pigeon-hole her charm.

One of the most searching analyses of her personality is the following written by a New York critic:

"Her hair is auburn, her eyes are green, and her smile is contagious; she's brisk, crisp, electric and profane," so says Ward Morehouse columnist of the N. Y. Sun. "In a single year she has skyrocketed to the top, the very top. With deliberate casualness she conquered Hollywood, decisively and completely. Her name is the No. 1 name of the amusement world."

"Kate Hepburn is as friendly as she is frank; and she is, I discovered, actually shy—a fact generally concealed by her overdirectness. Yes, I suppose, 'shy' should be grouped with all the other adjectives—crisp, piquant, staccato, eager, brisk, dynamic, elusive, vital, patrician—and profane."
