

CARROT RECIPE DOES THE TRICK

Children sometimes have queer notions about the vegetables they do and do not like. Many refuse carrots, which are rich in vitamins and an essential part of the diet. Mrs. A. J. Wieser sent in

this suggestion last week to the Recipe Round Table contest for making carrots attractive to children as well as to grown-ups:

Carrot Flower Pots
Select medium sized carrots. Remove outer skin, cut in two-inch lengths and steam in small amount of salted water. When tender, remove from sauce pan and press a sprig of parsley in the center of the larger end of carrots. Stand on the smaller end to look like small flower pots. Serve with white sauce. These are also

an attractive garnish on a platter surrounding a roast.

HAYESVILLE, June 21.—Funeral services will be held from the Rigdon funeral parlors Friday, June 22, at 1:30 o'clock for Linnie M. Kenton, who passed away at the Salem Deaconess hospital Wednesday after a lingering illness of four years.

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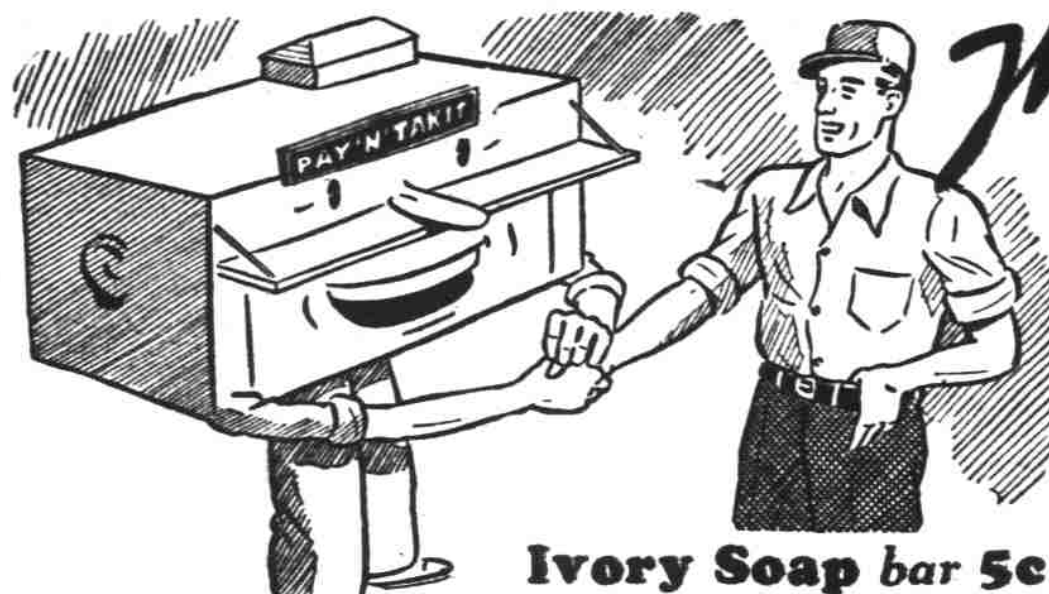
