

GOOD GOLD TESTS FROM ELKHORN ORE

SCIO, June 28.—The shaft at the Crown mine on the Little North Fork of the Santiam river, in the Elkhorn district, is believed to be penetrating an extensive body of very good ore, according to latest report.

"A recent assay sample taken along the hanging wall side of the shaft and sent to Engineer J. Cleveland Haas in Portland gave a gold value alone of \$6.30, with values in copper and silver also," R. E. Peery, manager of the mine, said. At a point five feet deeper a heavy mineralization of copper has been encountered on the same side of the shaft, and assays are being rushed to Portland to determine its value, he added.

Mr. Peery stated that the nights on the higher reaches have been quite cool of late, suggesting frost not far away. Sunday a heavy thunder storm passed through the Elk lake region, he said.

It is reported that the Silver King sale was ratified by the shareholders at a recent meeting in Albany, and that the new owners soon will start development work.

Nearly 31 Billion Feet Of Good Timber is Found In Linn County Forests

SCIO, June 28.—Linn county, though noted for its agricultural products, has more than two-thirds of its area covered with forests of some kind, according to a statement this week by Dr. J. E. Lodewick, in charge of forest products investigations at the Pacific Northwest forest experiment station in Portland.

Dr. Lodewick, assisted by J. M. Stevens, is making a study of the yield of pulpwood from white fir and hemlock on operations in the vicinity of Scio. It was considered by the forest service that the magnitude of these operations in Scio timber at this time would afford opportune occasion for helpful survey work, hence Dr. Lodewick, a specialist in his line, was dispatched to field work here. The survey is to cover several weeks.

The forest experiment station recently has completed a survey and cruise of all timbered areas west of the Cascade mountains in Washington and Oregon, and the most accurate forest statistics yet accumulated for this region are now being released.

"Of the 1,475,425 acres of land in Linn county, about 974,000 bear coniferous forests of some kind, 24,000 have hardwood forests, while the remainder is non-forested and used mostly for agriculture," Dr. Lodewick said. "On the basis of the survey the

county is still well supplied with old-growth timber," the expert continued. "Official statistics show that there are 242,000 acres on which Douglas fir, over 40 inches in diameter, make up over 60 per cent of the stand, and 325,000 acres on which Douglas fir from 20 to 40 inches comprise over half the stand."

"Areas in which hemlock over 20 inches in diameter form over half of the stand total nearly 29,000 acres."

According to figures presented by Dr. Lodewick, Linn county has nearly 2000 acres of land cut over prior to 1920 which is not restocking to new growth. To this should be added some 34,000 acres of old burn on which new trees are not being established. "These areas are producing no income and are a direct loss to the people of the county," Dr. Lodewick observed. Since 1920, about 14,000 acres have been cleared out. Some of these are restocking, others are not, he said.

"The survey indicates a stand of 30,876,310,000 board feet of timber in the county, of which approximately 18,000,000,000 feet are in private ownership. Old-growth Douglas fir totals about 17,000,000,000 feet, 2nd growth fir 5,000,000,000, western hemlock nearly 5,000,000,000, western red cedar 500,000,000, and white fir 1,500,000,000. Among the hardwood species, maple leads with 73,000,000, followed by alder with 18,000,000 and cottonwood with 11,000,000."

According to Dr. Lodewick, Linn county has in its forests a source of steady future supplies for its mills and industries. "One of the first concerns of the people should be for the welfare and safety of this source of income," Dr. Lodewick advised.
