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Hot Vegetable Dishes Are Popular When Summer Day Is Cool; Recipes Offered

If the summer continues cool as it has been the past week, hot vegetable dishes for luncheon and dinner will be in more demand than the usual cold combinations. Carrots are always inexpensive and plentiful and the following recipes contributed to the Round Table suggest three different ways in which to serve them:

Carrot Ring
2 good sized bunches of carrots, cooked and mashed
4 eggs
3 tablespoons flour (sifted)
3 tablespoons melted butter
Beat the eggs separately. Add the yolks to the carrots. Season to taste with pepper and salt. Add flour and butter. Add the well beaten whites last. Bake 40 or 50 minutes in a buttered and floured ring. Turn out on hot platter. Fill the center with buttered peas or creamed chicken.

Parsleyed Carrots
Scrape carrots and cut in long strips. Place in pan, cover with water and salt and bring quickly to boiling point on top of stove. Cover pan and place in oven with ham. When ready to serve drain, season with butter, salt and pepper. Sprinkle with finely chopped parsley when arranged on serving platter.

4 cups diced carrots
2 cups medium thick white sauce

1 tablespoon minced pimientos
1 tablespoon diced celery
1 tablespoon minced parsley
1 teaspoon grated onion
Cook the diced carrots until tender and drain. Meanwhile add the other ingredients to the white hot sauce. Pour over carrots. Serves 6.

PRUNE CODE TOPIC HERE ON SATURDAY

In an effort to be certain of stabilization of the prune market this season, a group of leading growers in this section have called a meeting for the chamber of commerce auditorium Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock, when steps will be taken toward formulating a code for the industry.

All prune men in the Salem district are invited to attend the meeting. Growers here hope to see a similar session held in Roseburg within the next few days.

While canners and packers have done no buying this season, so far as can be learned, growers hold that some prices at which canners have already sold some futures indicate a poor price for the grower.

A large attendance is anticipated at the meeting Saturday, for without a good representation of growers it will not be possible for steps to be taken toward formulating a code to be carried forward.

A representative of the state department of agriculture will be on hand to meet with the growers and give assistance in the formation toward seeking a code.

Hounds Get 2 Foxes; Third Caught Alive

DALLAS, June 28.—Three young gray foxes that had made a large score against turkeys and chickens in the Salt Creek community were brought to justice Tuesday when dogs killed two of them and the third was captured alive.

The foxes had been working in the vicinity of Salt Creek for about two weeks and had killed 100 turkeys and several hens in addition to robbing several nests.

Allan Dunn of Polk station had his hounds trailing the foxes and the dogs finally killed two when they were rounded up in an old snag on the Henry Hoekstre farm. The third fox was taken alive when the snag was cut down and was sent to a fox farm at Tillamook.
