

SIGNING OF BRIDGE BONDS IS DELAYED

Washburne, Baldock Out of Reach; First Funds to Be Received Soon

Form of the temporary bonds, covering an advance of \$1,000,000, for construction of the five Oregon Coast highway bridges, arrived here Thursday for signature of the state highway commission. The form was prepared by J. M. Devers, attorney for the commission who is now in Washington, and the legal department of the federal public works administration.

Members of the highway commission probably will meet in Portland Saturday or Monday, when the temporary bonds will be signed and deposited with the state treasurer. The treasurer, in turn, will send a receipt to the public works administration. When this receipt is received in Washington the million dollar advance will be forwarded to a Portland bank, subject to withdrawal by the highway commission.

Officials said that the advance of this money would make it possible for the highway commission to start construction operations on all five of the bridges, pending receipt of the entire federal loan aggregating \$5,206,000. It previously had been proposed to hold a meeting of the highway

NATION TO DEMAND EQUALITY ON DEBT

WASHINGTON, July 5.—(AP)—Secretary Hull today began a study preliminary to drafting a strongly worded note to demand from Germany treatment equal to that accorded any other country in interest payments on Young and Dawes bonds.

Hull was out of Washington over July 4 when Great Britain and Germany reached an agreement providing for payment to British bondholders at the expense of other nationals. He returned late today, and immediately gave his attention to the question of discrimination against Americans.

Undersecretary Phillips, in Hull's absence, informed newspapermen Germany had not yet answered the last American note. In that communication Hull rejected German excuses for the moratorium on all foreign obligations, and insisted particularly on equality of treatment for American bondholders.
