resulting from the maritime tie-up became more apparent. Some oil companies were delivering 10 barrels of oil on a 40 barrel order, and others made no deliveries at all, conserving what supplies they had for the Puget Sound and Lake Washington ferries, the latter already operating on a reduced schedule.

After a hearing lasting five hours, a coroner's jury found that Steve Watson, special deputy sheriff fatally shot in a downtown disturbance Monday, had come to his death "by reason of a bullet wound inflicted by some unknown person during the riot." The jury suggested, however, that the case be held open in the event further evidence is uncovered toward identification of Watson's assailant.

**SAN FRANCISCO, July 12.—(AP)**—Like a city under war siege, San Francisco hurriedly took stock of supplies tonight as striking teamsters joined with maritime workers in a land and water blockade and general walk-out alarms spread.

Final hopes for immediate restoration of peace rested in a board appointed by President Roosevelt under the new federal labor disputes law which is extending every effort toward an armistice in the two-month-old maritime strike.

fibres from each ton of flax purchased.

### PREBLE'S ADVICE

Any effort to bring Judge Charles M. Thomas, state public utilities commissioner, into the Salem municipal water controversy is a political move to get publicity in an election year and will prove barren of results, Jim Preble, chairman of the legislative committee of the Salem Trades and Labor Council, declared Thursday.

"Dan Kellaher is a political appointee of Governor Meier, and Judge Thomas is a political appointee of Governor Meier," Preble said, "and Kellaher's motion which was adopted by the Salem Public Ownership League Wednesday night was inspired by forces seeking publicity rather than a sensible advancement of the water project."

# UNIQUE CORN IDEAS IN WINNERS' LIST

### Green Corn Salad

3 tender ears corn  
1 small, tender cucumber for each serving  
1 cup mayonnaise  
1 tsp. chili sauce  
1 tsp. sugar  
1 tsp. lemon juice  
1 tsp. horseradish  
2 tbsps. each chopped sweet pepper and cucumber  
Add to pot of boiling water holding 2 quarts a tablespoon of sugar and a teaspoon of salt. Drop in corn and cook 20 minutes. Drain, chill and cut from cob, being careful not to cut off any hard part. Peel out enough of the pulp to leave a hollow. Keep what is cut out to use in dressing with sweet peppers. Drop cucumbers in ice water until time to serve. Do not add salt to the water as it will take away their crispness. Beat the mayonnaise with the other seasonings. Drain the chilled corn and add to the dressing. Wipe inside of the cucumber boats dry with a napkin and fill with corn dressing. Serve on lettuce leaves. This combination is delicious to fill ripe tomatoes also. Serves 4.

### PREBLE'S ADVICE

Those irresponsible friends of the water project who urge paying the water company's asking price overlook entirely the responsibilities of the water commission when it takes over the plant. The commission must have enough of the bond issue left to make additions and betterments as the city grows. Paying \$95,000 for the plant will be disastrous to the financial set-up and will pave the way for severe criticism of municipal ownership in years to come.

"Those who favor paying any old price just so they get hold of the plant complain loud enough now, but where will they be when the books have to be balanced later on? The condemnation suit provides a safe and sane way to determine the true physical value of the plant and will end the controversy once and for all.

"Any other course will continue to leave the city council open to flank attacks from the bondholders who are trying to get the best possible liquidation on what they now realize was a boom-time investment.

"The federal courts do not delay cases of public importance but give them preference over private litigation. Furthermore, petty technicalities and delaying tactics are not tolerated by the federal judges who rule promptly and decisively.

"The city is pushing the condemnation case in good faith. The next move by the city should be to urge PWA to advance money for construction work on the gravity supply line. This can be done as soon as the engineers get their checking plans back to Washington, which will be in a few days. A competent representative should be sent to Washington by the city council, just as other government-



**GRAND COULEE JOBS HELD FOR BOURBONS**

**SPOKANE, Wash., July 12.—(AP)**—The Spokesman-Review tonight said democratic party approval was required of applicants for work with the reclamation department on the Grand Coulee dam project.

R. F. Walter, chief engineer of the U. S. reclamation service, the paper said, has sent the following notice to all applicants:

"The secretary of the interior requires that each recommendation submitted to him for appointment to a non-civil service position in the bureau of reclamation be supported by clearance from some appropriate official in the democratic party organization."

This "clearance," as the paper quotes the Walter letter, would come from either the chairman of the democratic county committee, the chairman of the democratic state committee or the chairman of the democratic central committee.

County Chairman Elwyn Daniel, the paper said, explained that the "clearance system" was instituted because too many republicans had obtained appointments and because the republican party, when in power, had appointed only republicans.
