Mr. Looney was drowned in the Santiam soon after coming to Jefferson. His widow married Nelson R. Doty of Rochester, N. Y., a pioneer of 1844.

Mr. Doty was in the gold rush to California in 1849, where he was successful. He was also a volunteer in the Cayuse war and the first justice of the peace in southern part of Marion county.

Combine cream, sugar, salt and eggs. Add soda sifted with flour. Add cornmeal last. Bake in quick oven.

1/2 cup Borden's sweetened condensed milk
1 can or 2 1/2 cups corn
1 cup chopped green pepper
2 tablespoons pimento pepper
chopped
1 tablespoon chopped onion
