DANIEL HILDRETH DIES AT VANCOUVER

SCIO, Aug. 7.—Daniel H. Hildreth, 75, of Scio, who died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Eva Mulligan in Vancouver, Wash., August 3, was buried Monday afternoon of this week at that place, beside the grave of his wife, who died April 17 last. He had been in declining health for several weeks.

Mr. Hildreth was born in Iowa May 5, 1859, and came to the Pacific northwest at the age of nine years, residing in Washington until 1915, when he and his wife settled on the farm a few miles east of Scio which still is the property of the estate. He had followed farming and dairying most of his life, and was thus engaged until 10 days prior to his death. He was a member of the Elks lodge for a number of years.

Children surviving are Mrs. Ethel Aaby, Portland; Mrs. Eva Mulligan, Vancouver, Wash.; Jesse H. Hildreth, Scio; Delbert Hildreth, Oildfield, Cal.; and Mrs. Mary Livingston, Vancouver, Wash.
