

OUTLOOK FOR WELL WATER HERE GOOD

Experienced Men View Area Where Adequate Supply May Be Expected

Crawford Reid of R. M. Wade & Co., Portland, who handles Pomona pumps, and R. J. Strasser of Portland, well driller, who were in Salem on business yesterday took time to look over the possibilities of wells as a supply source for the city.

They viewed the flat in the vicinity of the airport and up to the hills. Strasser expressed the belief that an abundance of water could be obtained there, and that it would be quite soft in quality as compared with other well water. Such he said was true

of the well at the girls' training school.

"There are two methods of testing an area for its water resources," said Strasser. "One is by drilling a test hole. Experienced men can usually tell by the formation if it is water bearing. Another method is to drill a well and test it out, using it if it proves a success."

Both men commented on the great number of industrial wells which have been put down in Portland in industrial plants and are supplying pure water at less than a third the cost of Portland's Bull Run water which is only 50 a hundred cubic feet.

"The Dairy Cooperative is producing its supply at a cost of from 1 1/2 to 2c a hundred cubic feet," said Reid, "and that figure includes operation, maintenance, interest and depreciation. The plant is a new one and depends on this source for its water, having no connection with the city mains."

"The Libby cannery has one

12-inch well which pumps 1,400-2,000 gallons per day and the Northwest Ice and Cold Storage Co. has three drilled wells.

"Los Angeles city has many wells which it uses in addition to its other sources."

"Well water with a slight amount of 'hardness' in it is really more healthful than 'pure mountain water' which is devoid of all chemical content."

STORAGE ROOM FOR HOPS IS DWINDLING

With the bigger warehouses here already crammed with 1934 hops, there may be dearth of storage room until eastern buyers call in their hops, it is indicated. Many tons of hops are still held in the hop houses while picking has not yet been finished.

Picking will be finished before the middle of next week.

Little or no activity in the hop market is evident with no contract business going on except for some ready held. One sale of fuggles at 23 cents, but only a small lot, was made this week and there have been a few scattering sales of clusters at prices ranging from 18 to 21 cents since picking started.

The Pacific coast hop carry-over of all ages at the first of this month was 42,292 pounds, which is 34,345 bales more in growers' hands than at the beginning of the picking season a year ago. With this annual carry-over, there is little immediate prospect of a raise in hop prices to the growers.

CHURCH STRUCTURE TO BE COMPLETED

Completion of the Englewood United Brethren church building project, started three years ago, will get under way next Monday, the new pastor, Rev. R. C. Mann who came here last week from Walla Walla, announced yesterday following a meeting of the church board.

The main church building, about 44 by 76 feet, will be finished in both first and second floors. The auditorium will be enlarged so it will have a seating capacity of 600 persons; the dining room and kitchen will be completed; and an addition will be made on the west side of the church building, located at 17th and Nebraska streets.

When the project was started three years ago, the main building was erected but no interior finishing done, due to the depression. The work now contemplated will be finished before the first of the year, it is expected.

Rev. Mann, a contractor before he entered the ministry, has had considerable experience in church building programs. For three years he was with the church's general erection society as field secretary, and while he was pastor at Detroit, Michigan, Smithfield and Rockford, Illinois, and Stillwater, Oklahoma, new church edifices were built. He has drawn plans for a number of other churches.

Rev. Mann was pastor at Detroit five years, at Cedar Rapids, Iowa, four years, Enid, Oklahoma, three years, then at Smithfield, Rockford and Stillwater in turn and at Walla Walla two years prior to coming here.

Berserk Prisoner Given Heavy Fine

BOURBONS ACCLAIM SINCLAIR PROGRAM

SACRAMENTO, Sept. 20.—(AP)—Up to Sinclair's "epic" plan by which unemployed men would be placed on idle farm land and in defunct factories to produce their own necessities, was embodied virtually in full in the platform overwhelmingly adopted by the democratic state convention here today. The vote was 113 to four.

Among those voting in favor of the platform to which only one minor amendment was added in the convention as a whole, were George Creel, chairman of the convention and a man who ran second to Sinclair for the democratic gubernatorial nomination, and United States Senator William Gibbs McAdoo.

Cheering broke out after virtually every paragraph as Sheridan Downey, democratic nominee for lieutenant governor and a member of the platform committee, read the platform.

It opened with a declaration of fair in President Roosevelt and the new deal, carrying through with a revivification of conservatism and all other "isms" alien to the established form of government in this country, and reached its climax with a declaration of principles set down by Sinclair in his "epic" program.

The only discussion evolved around the method of taking the vote.

FRIENDLINESS FOR DUNNE EVIDENCED

PORTLAND, Sept. 20.—(Special)—Friendliness toward Senator Joe Dunne, republican candidate for governor, was evidenced through the southern and eastern portions of the state, according to Arthur W. Friauf, republican state chairman, upon his return to Portland this week following a strenuous 17-day campaign tour with the republican nominee.

Frequently Senator Dunne spoke from the same platform with Congressman James Mott, up for reelection from the 1st district; Jay Upton, the party's choice in the second district; and Earl Snell, republican nominee for secretary of state, all of whom have been actively campaigning during the past 10 days.

Displaying an intimate knowledge of the problems of all classes, and of agriculture and industry in every locality visited, Senator Dunne made a favorable impression wherever he appeared, according to State Chairman Friauf.
