came to Salem 24 years ago. He followed the occupation of auctioneer. Served as Democratic State Leader, Dakota.

Born in Marion, Indiana, in 1877, he had lived in many mid-Missouri and South Dakota. In the latter state he was prominent in politics, serving for some time as state chairman of the democratic party. Of that party he was always an ardent supporter. He worked earnestly here in 1932 for the election of President Roosevelt.

Baldwin loved a political campaign and delighted in the weeks before the recent November 6 election in making talks in behalf of his candidacy and of the ticket throughout this county.

Since his wife died four years ago he lived alone at 2250 West Nob Hill.

Daughter and Four Sisters Survive

He is survived by his daughter, Mrs. Clark Ritchey of Hayerville, two grandsons, Marion Ritchey and Gordon Ritchey, and by four sisters: Mrs. Jane Doudna of Tucson, Ariz.; Mollie Baldwin of Pasadena, Calif.; Mrs. Sophie Reeves of Guide Rock, Neb.; Mrs. Elizabeth Roberts of Marion, Ind.

Mr. Baldwin was a life-long member of the Friends church and was affiliated with the Friends church in south Salem. He was a member in the east of the Masonic lodge.

The body was taken to the Clough-Barriek funeral parlors. Funeral arrangements had not been made last night.

BEQUEATHED BLOCK LEFT UP TO SOLONS

Whether the state will accept the M. F. Mulkey building, at Second avenue and Morrison streets, Portland, under the provisions of a will executed by its owner many years ago, is the question that will have to be decided by the 1935 legislature, the state board of control decree yesterday.

This was determined by the board following a discussion as to whether the state would advance approximately \$1900 to liquidate street and sewer assessments now levied against the property.

"Is this the building that State Treasurer Holman desires to remodel at a cost of \$40,000?" Governor Meier asked.

"Yes, that is the building," Secretary of State Stadelman replied.

"That is the most assinine proposal that I ever heard of," Governor Meier continued. "Buildings worth ten times as much as the Mulkey property are being torn down. Even though the building were remodeled it would not house more than a fraction of the state activities."

Stadelman said he agreed with Governor Meier and thought the state would be at the losing end of a bad bargain.

It finally was agreed to refer the Mulkey will to the legislature without recommendation.

ADULTS CAN LEARN, KAISER TELLS CLUB

"Too old to learn?" was answered in the negative by Superintendent Silas Kaiser in addressing the Rotary club yesterday noon. Modern psychologists no longer believe the old adage, "You can't teach an old dog new tricks," and a recent book, "Life Begins at Forty," showed how men adapted themselves to changed circumstances and acquired new skills and new knowledge. A person's abilities do not atrophy with age but through disease. Each individual should continue his program of learning, said the educator.

"We do not lose our power of learning, but adults are apt to be too impatient and too easily discouraged to persist in acquiring new skills and new learning. Memory does not begin to slip in maturity. The brain has the same ability to memorize but those faculties are not used as in childhood."

"Modern conditions have made it necessary for mature people to change occupations. Adult education is a growing factor in the scheme of education. Recently a railroad company which changed from steam power to electric took its steam engineers and trained them to become motormen on the new equipment and the men made good."

COUNTIES TO FIGHT CHANGE, O-C GRANTS

Marion county will stand with 17 other "land grant counties" of the state in opposing the placing of the Oregon & California land grants with the national forest department, James E. Smith, Marion county commissioner, announced yesterday. Smith represented the county Tuesday at a meeting of the executive committee of the Oregon & California Land Grant Counties.

The 18 counties having Oregon & California federal lands in their territory have received for many years under the Stanford act, a sizeable turnover in taxes from the federal government. These were in lieu of taxes received by the counties when the Oregon & California railroad owned the lands.

If the national government puts these lands into its national forest, the affected counties fear they will lose all the taxes. For Marion county these run nearly \$7000 a year; for counties like Douglas they run to \$46,000 a year.

Guy Gordon, district attorney of Douglas county, is to represent the association of counties, to prevent the proposed placing of the lands in the federal forest.
