220 ACRES OF LAND SOLD IN 3 PARCELS

SCIO, Jan. 24. — Mrs. Ina Stoddard of Portland recently sold 220 acres of land a few miles southeast of Scio which was originally included in the donation land claims of John Gaines and E. B. MacInch. Emil Kotan purchased 120 acres at \$33, A. L. Riddle 30 acres at \$30, and Tripp & Murphy 70 acres at \$30, it is stated. Mrs. Stoddard is a sister of Lee Gaines of the Larwood area.

R. E. Peery, a farmer near Scio and manager of the Crown mine on the Little North Fork of the Santiam river in Marion county, was looking after business matters here this week. Peery reported deep snow in the Elkhorn mining district and that it might be several weeks before work in the Crown mines could be resumed.
