JOB OFFICE NEEDS COUNTY, CITY HELP

Continuation of the Marion county re-employment office on North High street will depend on continued help from the city and county governments here, Guy V. Lintner, state director of re-employment agencies, said yesterday while on an inspection trip here.

Lintner said the federal government's department of labor stood ready to match local appropriations for re-employment offices up to \$47,000 a year for Oregon. Since the legislature only provided \$12,000 a year for the offices any additional funds received from the federal government must be matched against moneys the city and counties provide for the offices.
Salem is paying \$50 towards the upkeep of the office here each month and Marion county is providing \$100.

UNITARIAN OFFICER TO SPEAK TONIGHT

Dr. Robert C. Dexter, secretary of the department of social relations of the American Unitarian association, will be in Salem Friday. At 8 o'clock Friday evening he will lecture, on "Understanding Hitler's Germany," at the First Unitarian church, North Cottage and Chemeketa streets.

Dr. Dexter is a well known writer, lecturer, and special investigator in social and economic fields. Dr. Dexter has attended assembly and council sessions of the League of Nations. He is exceptionally well qualified to give an account of Hitler's Germany and its relationship to world problems as he has spent the greater part of the last two years in Germany and Austria.

In 1926 he was one of a party of 50 university professors sent abroad by the Carnegie Endowment to study European conditions. At that time he visited and studied in Germany, and also studied conditions among Hungarian minority groups in Roumania. Dr. Dexter is a member of the Friends Service committee, representing the American Unitarian association. He is also a member of the Federal Council of Churches commissions on the church and social service and on international justice and good will. For several years he has been a member of the National World Court committee. The lecture is open to the public, as is the reception to Dr. Dexter following the lecture.
