SCIO BOARD ELECTS AND ALLOWS RAISE

SCIO, April 4.—Miss Bernice Newhouse, instructor in English and foreign languages in the Scio high school for the last three years, was reelected to that position at the monthly meeting of the Scio school board this week. Cecil Elder was retained as coach for his second year here.

Selection of a principal and a commercial teacher was deferred for the time being. It is understood neither F. A. Gallegly, who has officiated as principal here for eight years, nor Miss Doris Neptune, commercial and home economics instructor for the last four years, had applied for the positions for another year.

In the grades, Miss Blanche Johnson was offered another year as primary teacher; Miss Gertrude Tarr, incumbent, for the fifth and sixth grades; and E. P. Caldwell for the seventh and eighth grades. A fourth grade teacher is to be employed later if conditions warrant, it was agreed.

Salaries of all teachers were advanced \$5 per month for the next school year. The schedule announced at the meeting this week is as follows: Miss Newhouse, \$95; Cecil Elder, \$100; E. P. Caldwell, \$100; Miss Johnson, \$80; Miss Tarr, \$80.

MOLALLA, April 4.—A totem pole 80 feet high with carvings carrying out buckaroo symbols, such as Indians and bucking horses, is to be built in Molalla and placed on the buckaroo grounds, according to present plans. The pole will be built as an S.E.R.A. project by Earl Strong, who made the totem pole at the Detroit O.C.C. camp.

The Molalla Buckaroo association voted Tuesday night to sponsor the project, which means that the association will pay workmen's compensation and buy some paint. The project has already been approved by the county board.

MOLALLA, April 4.—The 88th birthday of Mrs. Mary Robbins was observed at a gathering of relatives and friends at the family home here Tuesday afternoon. Mrs. Robbins, known to Molalla people as "Aunt Mary Robbins," is a pioneer of 1852. She came across the plains from Ohio. That same year Oliver Robbins also crossed the plains. They met in Oregon and were married November 2, 1865. They celebrated their 88th anniversary in 1933. A short time later Mr. Robbins died.

When she was 68 years old, Mrs. Robbins underwent a serious operation for appendicitis and recovered completely in a short time. She now leads an active life. Several years ago she was one of the organizers of the Molalla Civic club and was instrumental in procuring a city park. She has two children, Mrs. Orla Buxton and Mrs. Kate Adams, both of Molalla; five grandchildren and six great grandchildren.
