### VOLUME OF LIQUOR SALES INCREASING

Present volume of business indicates that the gross returns of the state liquor control commission in 1935 will exceed \$5,500,000, according to figures released Thursday.  
During the 11 months the liquor stores and agencies were in operation last year the commission grossed \$3,154,569.30. During the first three months of this year the receipts aggregated \$1,241,279.13.  
Officials said the recent reduction in the price of liquor permits had stimulated business. Last year \$6,517 of these permits were issued. To March 30 of this year the permits totalled \$9,727. The commission also expects to save considerable money through discounts on its purchases.
