Stocks Skyrocket Again

SURVIVE SHOCK OF ROOSEVELT'S PLAN

NEW YORK, June 21.—(AP)—Wall Street's nerves appeared to have been only momentarily shaken by the president's taxation-to-distribute-the-wealth program.

In one of the three really vigorous rallies so far this year, stocks today more than recovered their yesterday's losses. Many issues pushed into new high territory for 1935 or longer with individual active shares scoring gains of 1 to around 4 points.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks advanced an even point to 44.7, topping the 44.5 peak made last Tuesday. The 30 industrials included in the calculation, with their gain of 1.4 points to 60.9, not only bettered the best mark of 1935 so far, but was within 1/2 point of the best figure for 1934, which was 61.4.

The advance of 8 of a point in the 15 utilities in the average of 32.5 was likewise a new 1935 top. Volume stepped up encouragingly on the advance, with the day's turnover in the stock exchange 1,517,240 shares, compared with slightly less than a million shares in the previous session. Chemicals and motors were among the most active groups, with good advances in both divisions.

Harvest Lateness Causes Price Rise

CHICAGO, June 21.—(AP)—Uncertainty over persistent delays to United States harvest operations in the southwest, especially Oklahoma, where heavy rains were reported, much to lift wheat values today.

The domestic wheat harvest is about 10 days later than normal, and arrivals of new wheat at southwestern centers are extremely meager. Wichita, Kan., for example, received but 19 cars today, against 411 a year ago.

With excessive rains regarded as probably starting both the quantity and quality of the winter crop, wheat prices here closed firm, 3/4c above yesterday's finish, September 81 1/2-3/4; corn 1 1/4 down, September 75 1/2-3/4; oats unchanged to 1/4 higher, and provisions unchanged to a rise of 3 cents.
