




An initiative petition opening the Rogue river to commercial fishing between Doyle's rock and Lobster creek, with the use of drift nets having a mesh of eight and one-half inches or more, between March 15 at 6 a. m. and June 30 at 6 p. m. of each year, was filed in the state department Baturday.

The petition was signed by the logue River Fishermen's union. phir grange and others.

Fishing with nets would not allowed from 6 p. m. Saturday nights to 6 p. m. Sunday nights.

The stream would be open to hook and line fishing during the same season and from June 30 to November 15 of the following year. During the latter season fishing would be exclusively by hook and line.

Completed petitions must contain 16,371 signatures and be filed with the secretary of state by July 1, 1936.

In case the petitions are completed the measure will go on the ballot at the general election in November next year. The legislature; at its last ses-


