The opener of the series on Monday night, August 5, will be a contest between the 20-30 club and the Salem Lions. Participants in the third game have not yet been announced.

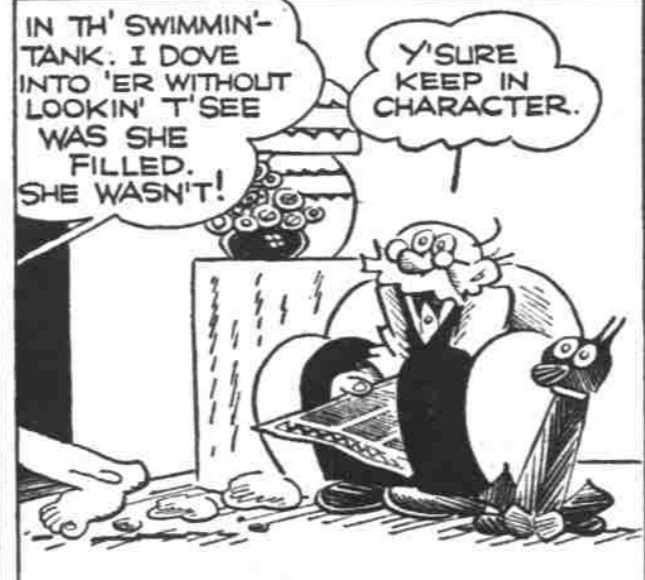
WOODBURN TOWNIES TAKE LEAGUE TITLE

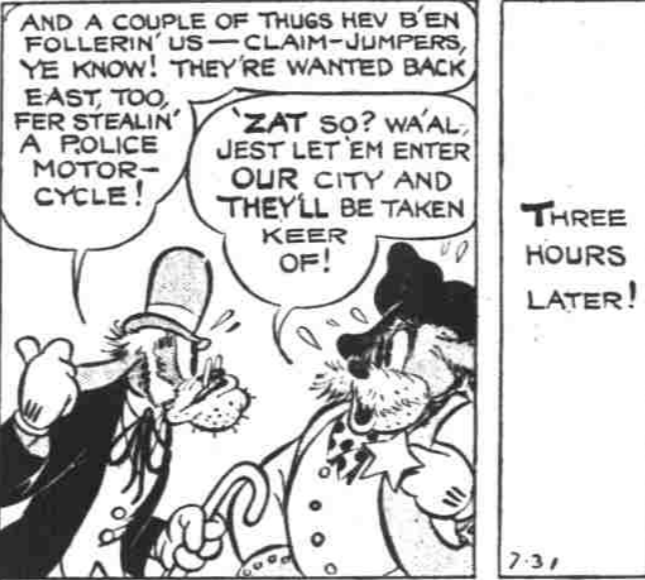

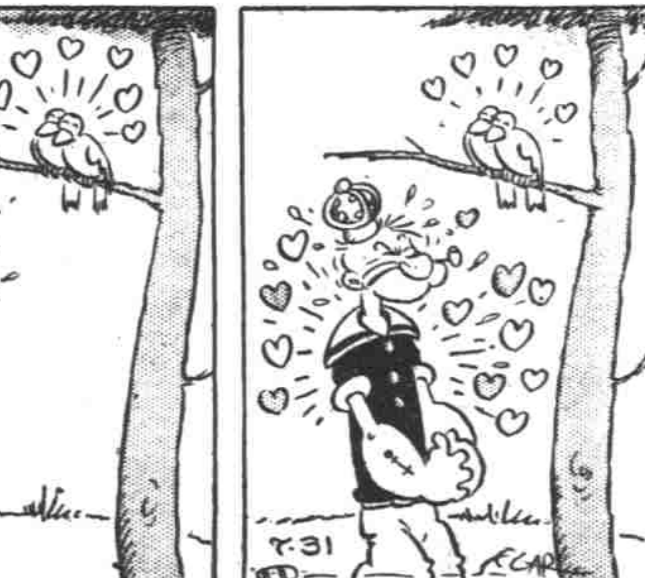

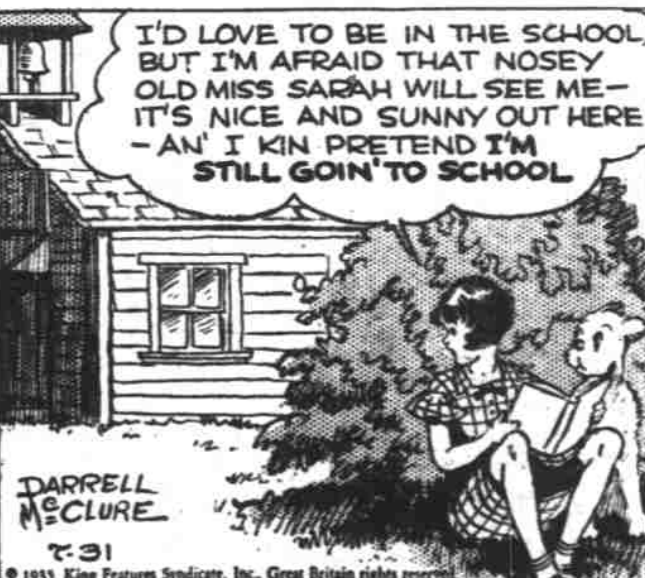
