

PIONEER CLAN HAS ANNUAL GATHERING

Looney and Doty Reunion is Held in Grove Out From Jefferson

JEFFERSON, July 31.—The descendants of William and Elmera Looney and wife, Elmera Looney Doty, held their annual reunion in the Doty grove northwest of Jefferson Sunday. This was the donation land claim Doty's father, Nelson Ransome Doty, homesteaded in 1846. Nelson Ransome Doty came to Oregon in 1844, taking active part in the Cayuse Indian war.

Mr. and Mrs. William Looney and five children started from Springfield, Mo., in the spring of 1849, going to Sacramento. From there to San Francisco, coming to Portland by ox team to the vicinity of Jefferson where they settled. Looney was drowned in the Santiam river after coming to Oregon, and his widow married Nelson Ransome Doty, who was shoemaker and saddler by trade and operated the first tannery in Marion county. W. E. Doty of Jefferson is the only survivor of the six Doty children.

A basket dinner was served at noon and swimming and various sports and visiting formed the division of the day.
