HOP DISTRICT JOB AGENCY WILL OPEN

A branch office of the state employment service to handle hop picking crews will be opened at Independence Saturday, according to J. E. Cooter, speaker of the house at the recent legislative session and now director of farm labor placement in Oregon.

Ralph Cooter, speaker of the house at the recent legislative session and now director of farm labor placement in Oregon, will be in charge of the hop district office, where Cooter will spend much of his time during the height of the hop season.

While not many would-be pickers are registering at employment offices in this vicinity, more calls for pickers than in any previous year are being received.

A survey August 1 showed that a few growers who had signed flat picking crews for the impending picking, Cooter declared, however, he believed there would be no shortage of hop labor. Persons wishing to register for hop picking may do so in person or by mail at the hop district office, or at the offices, stating the number in the group and the camping equipment available.

Cooter said picking of early hops would begin between August 20 and 25 and of late hops between September 1 and 5. Pickers' wages have not yet been set.
