WEATHER SHOWS IN BUTTER TRADE

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 8.—(AP)—There was a general showing of weakness in the butter trade today during the late session of the Portland exchange.

There has during the last few days been practically no speculative interest and while top score has not been in real surplus supply, the entire butter structure has suffered from weakness in the underscores.

Butter values were generally steady with most local interests paying around 27c lb.

Trading in the egg market locally was without general change. The state has added underize to the legal grades.

Acute shortage of lightweight broilers; those under 2 lbs. were confirmed. Sales were reported nominally to 15-15 1/2 lb. Other fowls were generally steady.

Tomatoes Higher

Advanced prices were shown for the day in the tomato trade with decreasing supplies. Most business in best stuff was \$2 a box with a few sales fractionally higher.

Market for cantaloupes showed a firm tone, including all offerings. There was a shortage of offerings from The Dalles and Yakima while Californian were higher as a result of a strong F. O. B. market.

Better situation is reported in the peach trade with much of the California stuff out of the way and better stuff coming from the mountain sections. Local stock was still the favorite.

HARDING HAS TOUR WITH CLUB GROUP

Wayne Harding, head of the 4-H club work in Marion county, returned Wednesday from a three-day tour with 100 Willamette valley club workers, through Washington and Yamhill counties.

Both boys and leaders were included on the interesting trip which was the first of its kind to their knowledge of stock judging and farm management, Harding reported.

Particularly interesting, Harding said, was the visit to the large "Foothill Farm" of Frank Brown in Yamhill county, where the group spent the evening in discussion of the first place.

Included on the tour were Lawrence Roberts and Mark Lewis of Salem.

Bulls Become Aggressive

COMMISSION HOUSE SALES HURT GRAIN

CHICAGO, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Selling by commission houses believed to be acting for Canadian interests did a good deal today to bring about lower prices here for wheat.

It was emphasized as significant that at eastern lake cities of the United States an import wheat from Canada. Rains in parts of Argentina, together with selling to anticipate any bearish surprise in the Washington government crop report tomorrow tended also to weaken wheat values.

After selling 2 1/2 cents a bushel, wheat closed nervous at 1 1/4-1/2 on yesterday's finish, Sept. 30-31, 1/4c unchanged to 1/2c lower, Sept. 7 1/2-1/2, oats 1/2-3/4 off, and provisions unchanged to 50 cents down.

Volume of Wool Sales Now Fair

BOSTON, Aug. 8.—(AP)—(U. S. Dept. Agr.)—A fair volume of business in the wool market comprised mostly fine and 1/2 blood territory wools and medium semi-bright fleeces. Sales have been closed on strictly combing 58-60, 1/2 blood territory at 70-72 cents scoured basis and at 66-69 cents on French combing of the same grade. Strictly combing 58, 1/2 blood semi-bright fleeces have been sold at 57-60 cents scoured basis. Prices were steady to firmer on the 64s and finer territory wools.

PORTLAND, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Apricots and peaches were the best sellers at the Thursday morning's early Gardeners' and Ranchers' wholesale market. Peaches were in slow demand Wednesday morning but the demand increased and prices had a slight tendency to rise.
