

### ROTARY CLUB VOTES PLAN ENDORSEMENT

Salem Rotary club Wednesday voted its endorsement of the plan developed by the state board of control and the Salem capitol committee for a site for the state capitol, after Mayor V. E. Kuhn explained the work that had been done. The plan embraces the acquisition of the Willamette university campus for capitol grounds, with the city and PWA assisting in making the purchase. The university would relocate on land in the Bush pasture tract.

Dean J. R. Jewell of the school of education at the state university at Eugene, spoke to the club, reading a translation from a German textbook which predicted the northwest would be the seat of the great civilization of the future with a possible population of 10,000,000 people in the area from Vancouver, B. C. south through the Willamette valley. Dean Jewell urged a practical education for the equipment of men and women to meet the problems of the future.
