Board Condemns Unsafe Trestles

Eleven trestles on the C. C. Arney logging railroad in Columbia county have been condemned by the state industrial accident commission, it was announced Thursday. Action was taken by the commission following an investigation and hearing in Portland. The commission's order declared that the trestles were unsafe and a menace. Use of the trestles was forbidden until they have been repaired or rebuilt. Logging operations over the road were conducted by the West Coast Logging company.

Resignation of Wallace Received by Governor

The order was issued under a statute which gives the commission authority to condemn property used by firms protected by the workmen's compensation act. Formal resignation of Lew Wallace as a member of the state game commission was received at the executive department Thursday. Governor Martin said his successor would not be appointed for a week. Wallace has announced that he will make a fight to retain his seat in the legislature. He lives in Portland.

Both the county truck and the Fox car were considerably damaged.
