

# Gridiron Attendance Record for Salem Likely to Fall Tonight

## Squads Ready For Big Test

### Bearcats and Spartans in Final Drill; Tickets Are Sold Rapidly

Each anxious for victory when they clash on Sweetland field at 8 o'clock tonight the Bearcats and the Spartans each went through brief drills on Sweetland field yesterday afternoon in preparation for the coast's first football game of major proportions.

Coches Dud DeGroot ran his squad of 25 through passing and pass defense drill and a bit of dummy scrimmage early in the afternoon. The Bearcats wound up their two weeks of pre-season drill immediately afterward.

Both squads showed lots of fire as they hurried through the final sessions before the eye of their intersectional clash. Both coaches were hopeful of victory but eyed with apprehensiveness the huskies of the opposing squad.

That Willamette's attendance

record for an opening game and possibly for any game may be broken was indicated yesterday as floods of reservations poured into the office of Leslie J. Sparks, Willamette graduate manager. No football battle staged on Sweetland field in recent years has caused as much interest as tonight's clash between the Bearcat and the men from Sparta.

Willamette's student body, full of enthusiasm for the game, keyed itself and the team to a high pitch with a rally staged at Liberty and State streets last night as a feature of fall opening. "Spec" Keene and Dr. Bruce Baxter expressed hope for a win while students cheered lustily.

Both teams will be going under fire for the first time of the season and both will meet coast conference opponents next week. San Jose entrains for home immedi-

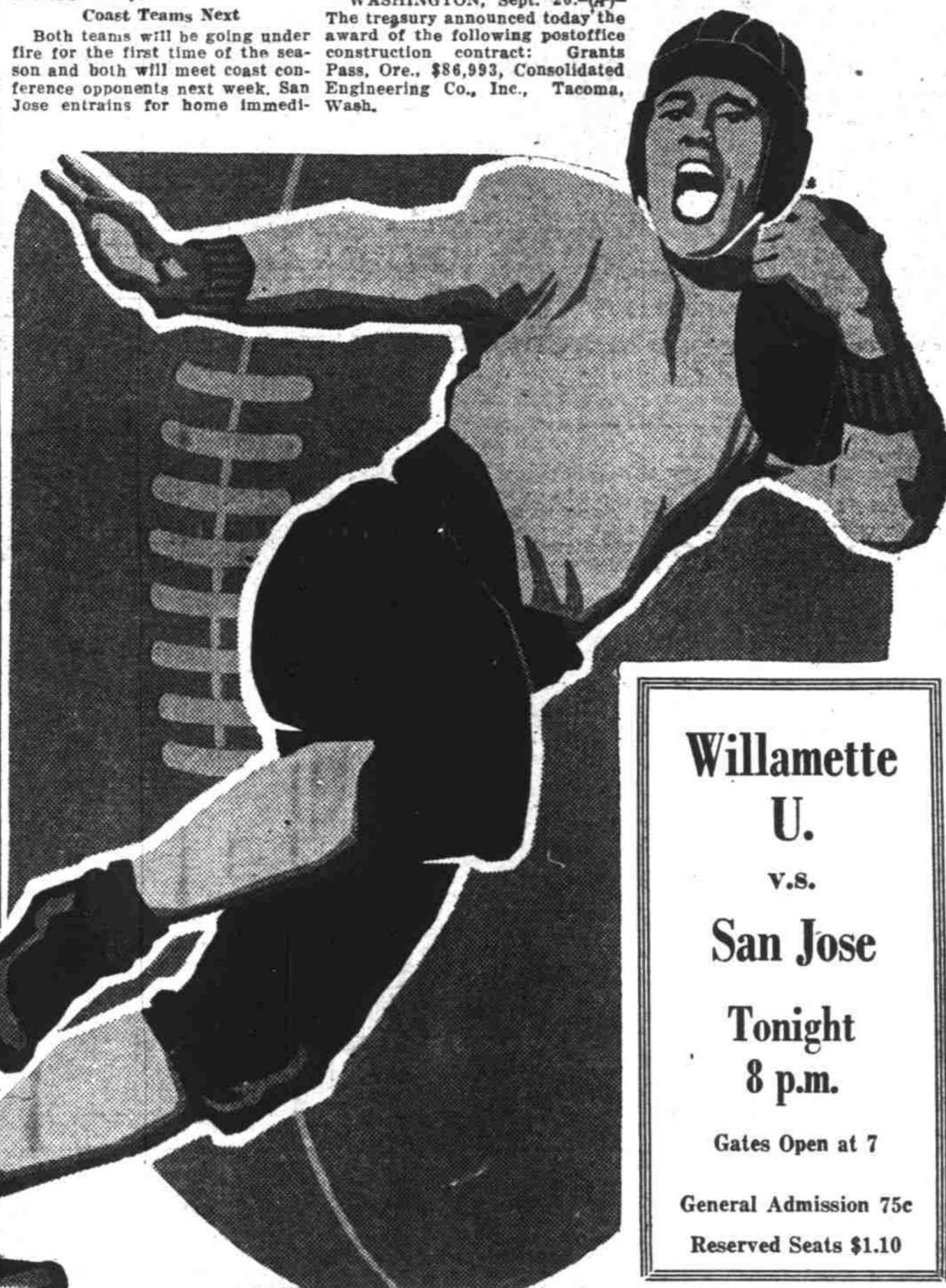
## Few Projects in County, Revealed

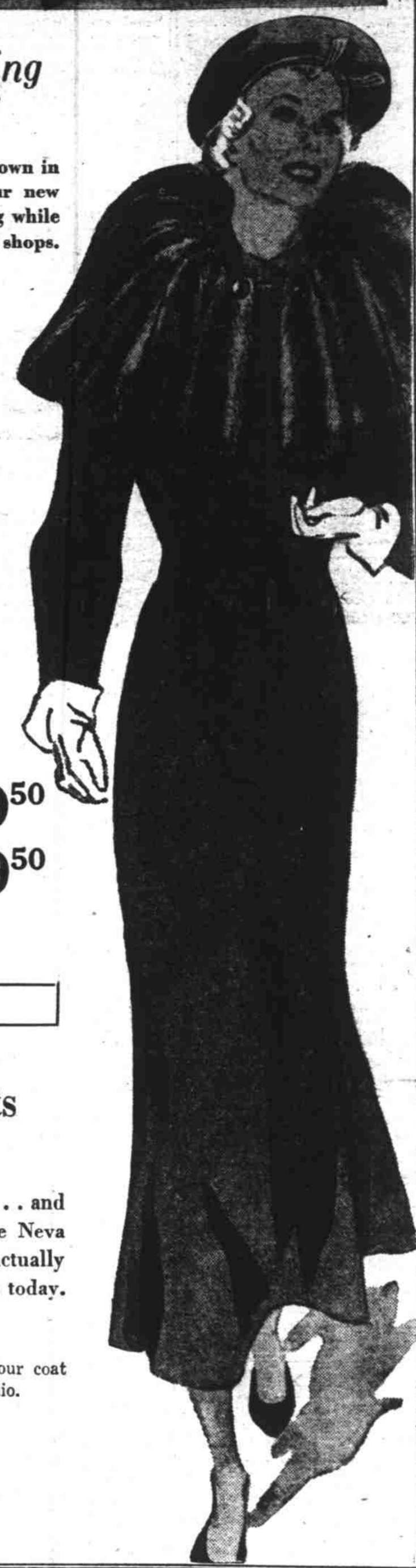
