

Young Couples Face Charges

Double Wedding Held; One of Party is Fugitive and Others Held

One bridegroom held on an auto theft charge, one bridegroom paying the police, and two brides in the custody of the police yesterday, followed a double wedding held in Vancouver Saturday night.

H. C. Shields, Salem, called state police to the Cold Spring auto camp, near the 12th street intersection with Pacific highway, Sunday morning, and told them that his son had stolen an automobile registered to Vern Dell Mathis, 487 North Winter street. The theft had been reported to police Thursday. Two license plates, reported stolen from the car of Ernest Clarke of Independence, were in the car.

The car was used by R. C. O. Shields, 16, Eugene Huntley, Frances L. Hart, and Doretha A. Huntley, all minors, for a trip to Vancouver, Wash., Saturday night. Where Shields is reported to have married Doretha Huntley and Eugene Huntley married Frances Hart. The four returned to Salem Saturday night.

Car is at Roseburg. Young Shields left the auto camp, hitch-hiking south, Sunday morning. A short time later, the Hillcrest service station reported that a car with a young driver had driven in from the south, stopped for gas and oil, and then driven quickly away without paying.

Although officers searched the Hillcrest vicinity immediately, they were unable to locate the car or its occupant. The car, stolen from Irvine Hæd, Albany, and driver were reported to have been in the vicinity of Liberty for several hours.

The car, which Shields reported seeing his son driving at about 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon, was discovered in Roseburg yesterday morning. Young Shields has been an inmate of a California reform school.
