

U.S. Bankers Attacked by Mexican Rebels Are Reported Safe

Raiders Flee To Mountains

Band of 80 Said Opposed to Religious and Farm Policies of Mexico

BALTIMORE, Oct. 15.—(P)—Secretary of State Cordell Hull advised former Senator William Cabell Bruce today his son James Bruce and four other American businessmen were safe after being reported in the hands of Mexican rebels.

When Bruce heard that the five men had been seized while on a hunting trip, he wired Hull for information. Hull wired back today advising from the American consul at Sonora indicated the party was safe.

Officials of the Fidelity and Deposit company here also expressed relief at the safety of Lee Paul, their active representative in Wheeling, W. Va.

MAGDALENA, Sonora, Mex., Oct. 15.—(P)—Rebellious Mexican raiders, who have already accounted for five deaths in the state of Sonora, today apparently withdrew to their mountain lairs as apprehension spread throughout the border district.

Fear for the safety of five prominent Americans on a hunting trip near here was alleviated, however, with word they had been released by an armed band of Mexicans who took their guns and ammunition.

All municipalities in this district have doubled their guards and armed private citizens against the possibility of further surprise attacks.

The main raiding band of about 80 men was reported composed of farmers and ranchers opposing the Mexican government's religious and agrarian policies.

A squadron of military airplanes was reported to have left Hermosillo at the command of General Juan Zertuche for the Santa Ana area in an effort to run down the raiders. At Santa Ana the mayor and chief of police were killed yesterday, and the bodies of three other men left by the roadside.

Chief of Neighbor State Tells View

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"I would not want to be presumptuous, but it has been our experience here in Washington that a substantial site is highly important. BUENOS AIRES, Oct. 15.—(P)—Lawyers in the eastern district of Chubut territory in Patagonia have been on strike since September 28 in protest to regulations of the civil courts, five lawyers who arrived here with a petition to the federal government, said today.

Five Wounded in Political Riot at Athens

ATHENS, Oct. 15.—(P)—Five persons, including a policeman, were wounded tonight in a burst of shooting on Constitution Square during an anti-monarchist demonstration. Communists and supporters of the exiled leader Venizelos shouted "long live the republic." Three were arrested.

Hauptmann Sleeps as Death House Companion Dies

TRENTON, N. J., Oct. 15.—(P)—John Favorito, 25, Edgewater mechanic, whose death sentence was reprieved two months ago, was put to death in the electric chair in state prison tonight for killing a man in a \$4 holdup. Favorito was the fifth man to die since Bruno Richard Hauptmann, convicted Lindbergh baby killer, was brought to the death house eight months ago. Prison authorities said Hauptmann was sound asleep when Favorito walked past the door of his cell into the electrocution chamber.

"Stay Down" Coal Strike Occurs in South Wales

NEWPORT, Monmouthshire, England, Oct. 15.—(P)—Complete stoppage of work in the coal fields of South Wales, was threatened today as 2,400 miners refused to come out of the mines in a "stay down" strike to force the ouster of employees not enrolled in the South Wales miners' federation.

Atrocities are Denied by Italian Officials

MOGADISHU, Italian Somaliland, Oct. 15.—(Havas)—Government officials denied formally tonight reports that a fleet of bombing planes had killed many women and children in Ethiopia villages. They also denied Italian planes had been brought down by Ethiopian anti-aircraft guns.

Laval's Peace Hopes Reach Low Ebb

PARIS, Oct. 15.—(P)—The hope Premier Pierre Laval has held steadfastly for an Italo-Ethiopian peace grew fainter today as he awaited Mussolini's terms for calling off his legions in Africa, officials said. Simultaneously the foreign office made an official denial of a report (not carried by the Associated Press) that the premier had requested Great Britain to withdraw its battleships from the Mediterranean.

actment. The governor has recommended a short session and the younger members, feeling that he knows the situation, declare they are going to stay in line with him and seek adjournment as soon as the building program is decided.

Walter Fuhrer, Romeo Gouley and Ronald Jones, all of the Marion county house delegation, all declared that they had no intention of introducing any bills at the coming session and thought the session should be made extremely short. Hannah Martin declared that the call of the governor stated that the session was for the purpose of considering the building of a new state capitol, to consider social security legislation and emergency legislation.

"I feel it my duty to conform to the official call of the governor and to consider any of the three subjects stated in the official call," Mrs. Martin said. She could not state definitely whether she would introduce any legislation.

Senator Douglas McKay does not contemplate introducing any bills at the present time.

"The governor's call is only for emergency legislation and I have nothing that can't be held until 1937," he said.

Senator Charles K. Spaulding has been thinking solely of introducing a measure concerning interest rates on taxes but has nothing definite yet in mind. "Some bills should be introduced, not many—no more than two or three," Spaulding said. "The session should be short and sweet," he added.

Split in Ethiopian Allegiance Claimed
Rome hailed the "cordial reception" which General Maravigna was reported officially to have received from priests of the Coptic Christian church at Aksum as indicating a definite split between Emperor Haile Selassie and the Ethiopian church.

Official spokesmen here appeared confident the rest of the world "would eventually come to the Italian point of view." Sanctions against Italy, they said, might be annoying, but Italy will not abandon its program in East Africa because of them.

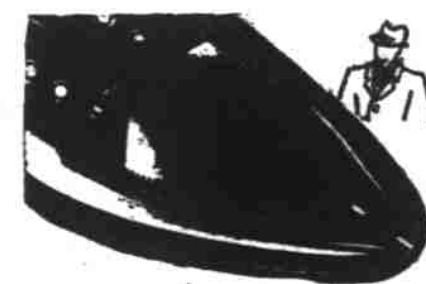

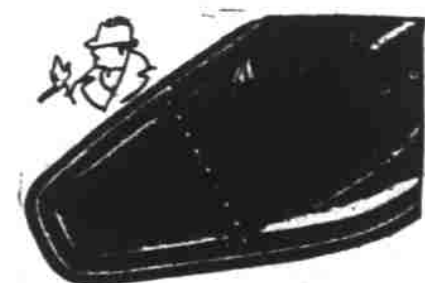
