### Graham Crackers Make Good Cake

**Club House Cheese Cake**  
Crust:  
20 Sugar Honey Maid crackers  
1/2 cup butter  
1/2 cup sugar  
Filling:  
1/2 cup sugar  
1 tablespoon flour  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 lb. cream cheese or cottage cheese (put through a ricer).  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
2 eggs  
1/2 cup cream  
Crumble the crackers fine and mix with soft butter and 1/2 cup sugar. Reserve 1/4 cup of this mixture. Line deep buttered pie plate or small spring form with remainder, pressing mixture firmly with fingers against sides and bottom of pan.  
Then mix 1/2 cup sugar, flour and blend thoroughly with cheese. Add vanilla and yolks of eggs and beat; add cream and mix again.

Fold in beaten egg whites. Pour mixture into crumb-lined pan. Spread with remaining crumbs. Bake in a moderate oven (350 degrees F.) until center is set, about 1/2 hour. A marvelous cheese cake; 6 portions. Preparation, 10 minutes.

### Lawn Edger to be Shown by Eckley

A gear driven lawn edger invented and patented by Junior Eckley, 798 North 20th street, Salem, will be among the new inventions on display at the inventor's show in the Portland Grand Central public market, beginning Saturday.  
The edger is designed effec-

tively to trim the grass that overhangs sidewalks and curbs and lies too flat for the ordinary lawn mower to touch. The machine is propelled along the walk edge by a handle, the driving wheel running on the walk, which serves as a guide. An inner gear in the driving wheel operates a revolving cutter blade. A sod cutter disc is mounted at the rear of the machine. Other features include reversible, self-sharpening cutter blades and patented wheel

securing device. No bolts or screws are used. The machine will be exhibited in Salem later.
