Announcement was made last spring in regard to the rules and contestants have had all summer to prepare. Entrants are under 23 years of age and non-professionals.

The audition is open to the public and contestants will be judged by members of the music committee of the orchestra association and Jacques Gerszkovitch, conductor.

Mendelssohn's beautiful "Capriccio Brillante" Opus 28, is the number to be played. It is well-known as an effective and brilliant concert solo.

These contests present a splendid opportunity for talented young pianists to gain the experience of playing with a symphony orchestra. Many outstanding young artists have gained their first recognition through winning such an honor. It is a yearly custom in the Portland Junior symphony.
