Closer co-operation between Italy and Austria was foreseen as a result of the coup which consolidated the numerous private armies of the nation under Prince Ernst von Starberg and ousted Maj. Emil Fey, minister of the interior and Starberg rival. Kurt Schuschnigg retained his post as chancellor in the cabinet shake-up which left Vienna in a state of alarm, under virtual martial rule.
