Crawford will be represented with Turner for a future date. There were 12 small vaccinations, nine toxoids, and 22 tuberculin tests given. Gladiolus Thrrips Remedy Is Given

Naphthalene Flakes Held Best Treatment For Diseased Bulbs

The state department of agriculture has issued the following instructions for treatment of bulbs for gladiolus thrips:

(1) Naphthalene flakes. This remedy is cheap and effective and is safe both to user and the corns. The flakes should be used at the rate of one ounce (four level tablespoons) for every 100 corns, or one pound to 2,000 corns.

Small lots of bulbs may be placed in paper bags or cartons. Sprinkle the flakes over the corns, close the top of the container so as to retain the fumes. For large lots place the corns in trays, scatter the flakes over them, stack trays and cover with a canvas paper. Do not put corns in tin cans or other airtight containers as the corns are likely to "sweat" and sprout. Before applying the treatment allow the corn to cure sufficiently so that they may be thoroughly cleaned. Burn all tops and trash. The length of time for this treatment is not less than four weeks, preferably eight weeks. The corns may be allowed to remain in the flakes all winter provided the flakes are shaken out one month before planting time and the corns allowed to air out.
