

Sister M. Placide Dies at Portland

MT. ANGEL, Jan. 9.—Sister M. Placide Casey, who died suddenly Monday afternoon while visiting in Portland, was buried from the convent chapel here Wednesday morning at 9:30. Rev. John Cumisky read the requiem high mass and also gave the funeral address. Rt. Rev. Abbot Thomas and Fathers Berthold and Maurus were present in the sanctuary. Interment was in the Sisters' community cemetery.

Sister Placide, nee Mary Jane Casey, was the daughter of an old pioneer family and was born near Woodburn June 25, 1863. She entered the Benedictine convent in 1883, observing her golden jubilee two years ago. For many years she held the position of secretary at the convent and taught here and in various Benedictine schools in Oregon and at the mission school in British Columbia.

Surviving are a brother, John Casey, of Billings, Mont., and three sisters, all of Eugene, Mrs. I. L. Campbell, Mrs. Charles N. Allen and Mrs. J. B. Coe.

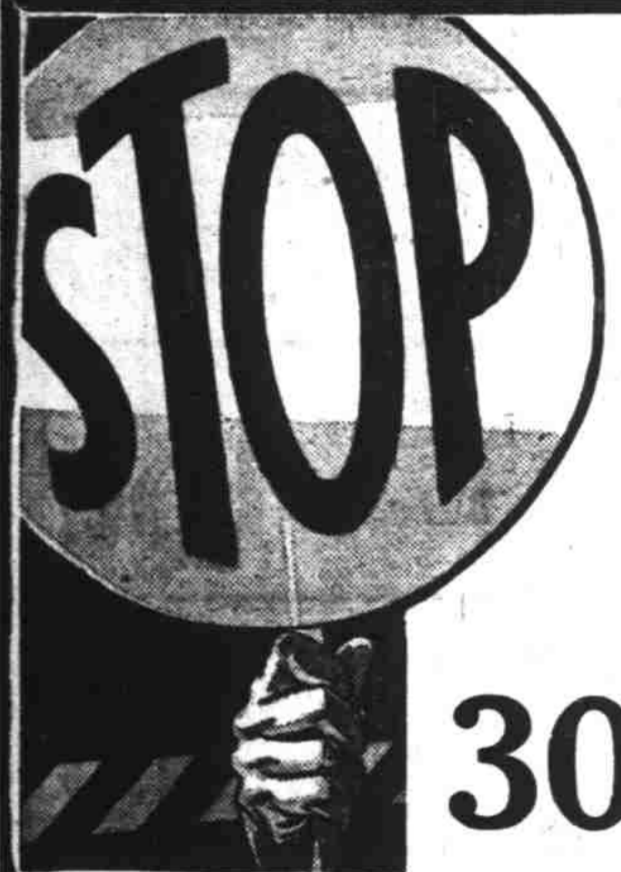

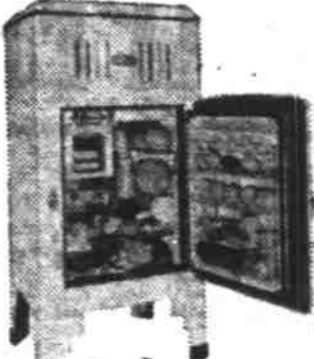
