Seven Salem educators and Mayor V. E. Kuhn have been given places on the program of the northwest district conference of the American Physical Education association to be held in Portland February 21 and 22, according to information received here yesterday.

Salem's playground program will be explained to the delegates by Mayor Kuhn and City Superintendent S. Galster. State Superintendent C. A. Howard will welcome the conference visitors while one of his assistants, Donald A. Emerson, will speak on "Physical Education Legislation in the Pacific Northwest," and another, Robert J. Maaske, will preside over the recreation section.

"Personality Factors and Success as an Instructor" will be discussed by Vernon Gilmore, director of physical education in the Salem school system. Eleanor M. Tonsing, physical education instructor at Leslie junior high school, will preside over the elementary and junior high school section of the conference.

Studies in men's physical education will be in charge of Leslie J. Sparks of Willamette university.

**Policies of PEP Accorded Praise**

Humanizing of Service Is Noteworthy; Griffith Lauded, Magazine

Recognition is given in the current issue of the Electrical World to the Portland Electric Power Co. for its outstanding success in "finding ways and means of being of greater service to its customers and of humanizing its organization in the eyes of the people of the territory it serves," reported W. M. Hamilton, Salem division manager, yesterday.

The magazine states President Franklin T. Griffith "his nationally known for his progressive ideas on public utility management."

The magazine analyzes PEP's handling of public service and employee relations.

It finds that the PEP system is based upon the well-known fundamental—the golden rule.

Mr. Griffith is quoted as saying, "Our customers are human beings and social by nature. The average person responds readily to fair treatment, courtesy, and friendliness.

"Our experience has been that public friendship depends upon more than dependable service at low rates. We discovered some time ago that there was another even more important element, namely, the way in which that service is rendered."

**"Quit Killing" Slogan Apparently Success as 1935 Death Toll Lower**

There were 54 fewer traffic fatalities in Oregon in 1935 than during the previous year, Secretary of State Neil reported Monday.

Fatalities in 1935 aggregated 259 as against 313 in 1934. Persons injured increased from 5307 in 1934 to 5865 in 1935.

There also was an increase in the number of accidents from 22,393 in 1934 to 23,353 in 1935.

**Bigelow in Headlines Again**

When Herbert S. Bigelow of Cincinnati, evangelist, Coughlin follower and utility foe, recently made the headlines when he held the mayoralty election in deadlock for a week, he wrote another chapter to a stormy and colorful career. Not until promised the chairmanship of the Cincinnati council utility committee did Bigelow, an independent, consent to break the deadlock between the four Republicans and four Charterists in council. Cincinnati has a city manager and operates under a charter which provides for election of a mayor from among the nine members of council. Bigelow went to Cincinnati in 1926 as pastor of the Vine street church but was ousted from the ministry when he leased his church to a theater company. His activities during the war as a pacifist, and his campaigning in the causes of the single tax, municipal power development and as supporter of Coughlin have kept his name in the headlines for years.
