(By The Associated Press) The biggest and bloodiest battle curtailed questioned powers with of the young African war has just been fought in the rugged passes of northern Ethiopia, with thousands reported slain. Both Italy and Ethiopia claimed victory.

In Addis Ababa the government said Makale, advance point of the Italians in the north, had been encircled. Two fascist divisions sent to relieve Makale were wiped out, officials added.

The battle, a communique stated, "finally ended in victory for Ethiopia with two important Italian fronts taken."

In Rome, the opposite was claimed. An official communique said the fascists had smashed Ethiopian forces planning an attack upon the northern army.

The Ethiopian dead were placed at 5000 and Italy's at 743.






