Banfield Condemns Blind Haste; Architectural Fee Percentage Set (Continued from Page 1) unexpected and emergency costs later. Most of the day's session was spent in studying the 46-page confidential outline of plans and in discussing the rules for the architectural contest.

In regard to the pending application for a \$450,000 state heating and lighting plant members of the commission suggested if FWA approval if forthcoming the plant be utilized to heat and light the new statehouse.

The discussion of the length of time deemed essential for getting the program under way brought a comment from Robert W. Sawyer of Bend that "we are trying to get things started." He said the board is not delaying action and that there have been no postponements.

Could said "I am sorry if I conveyed inadvertently the impression that the plans for the architectural competition would be ready sooner." He said he believed it would take two and a half months. Hockley said he thought six weeks would suffice.

In commenting that he believed nine months would be needed to put construction under way, Commissioner Banfield listed the following program: Two weeks before contest will be ready to start, eight weeks more for contestants to submit plans for three weeks for judging, five months to prepare working plans and have them checked by the state and government, and one month to advertise for bids and make the award.

The question of the site arose again today when Dr. Ernest Dalton advised the commission that Governor Charles Martin, who recently opposed acquisition of a portion of Willson park, was now in favor of acquiring from the city of Salem the east end of the plot. He would have the main entrance of the capitol facing North Summer street and utilize about 200 feet of park land.

An attorney General's ruling recently held the capitol could not be constructed on other than the city site, due to legislative limitations.

Chairman J. A. McLean of Eugene said following the meeting he was urging Commissioner Banfield to reconsider his resignation from the three-man executive committee.

McLean said the commission probably would continue in session tomorrow.

Chlorination Only Issue Raised Says Stricker Answering Inquiry (Continued from Page 1) whether a good supply of water can be obtained from the well. This can be determined only by trial. The water in the power ditch is undoubtedly satisfactory except that it is not bacterially pure. It seems a wiser and more economical plan to use the present supply with adequate chlorination rather than continue with the well. If chlorination is properly controlled, no objectionable tastes will be noticed and the water will be effectively sterilized.
