

Protest on Dogs Running at Large is Heard by Town Council

Condemnation Law Is Passed

Fine, Sentence Provided For Violation of Ordinance

WOODBURN, March 6 — At the regular meeting of the Woodburn city council Tuesday night, Mrs. Ollie Bogard asked that something be done about the dogs of the city running at large. Her protest was noted but no action was taken. There is an unenforced ordinance regarding this matter.

An ordinance was passed giving the council authority to condemn dangerous buildings and structures in the city, providing punishment for maintaining such buildings, providing for the abatement and removal thereof, the cost of such removal or abatement to be charged to the property.

Law Has Teeth
The ordinance provides that 10 days after proper notice the owner or person in possession of such buildings, upon conviction in the recorder's court, shall be fined, not to exceed \$100 or imprisoned 50 days, or may be given both the fine and imprisonment penalty in the judgment of the court. The ordinance becomes effective at once.

George Krimmins who expects to open Ann's Sandwich shop on the Pacific highway about April 1, applied for a license to sell beer. This was approved.

Orders were given to install new timbers under the old fire bell at the tower in the city hall to keep the bell from falling.

First Rural Mail Carrier and Wife Are Feted at Surprise Affair For Their Silver Wedding Anniversary

TURNER, March 6 — Mr. and Mrs. Fred C. Gunning were the inspiration for a surprise party Wednesday night, the occasion being their silver wedding anniversary. They were married March 4, 1911, by Rev. F. G. Drake, in the senior Gunning home, where they have since resided.

Fred C. Gunning was born at Orura, Wis., May 9, 1874. When a young child, he moved with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Felix C. Gunning, to Kansas, and in 1893 the family moved to Oregon, living at Stayton and Salem for a few years before establishing the family home in Turner.

Miss Nellie Durfee was born at Vinton, Iowa, November 6, 1877, and moved with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Durfee, in 1878 to Kansas; the family came to Shaw in 1892. She taught in Marion county grade schools, also on the coast for a number of years, four of which were spent in Turner school.

Mr. Gunning began carrying mail October 16, 1897, on the first rural route in Oregon, it being tried as an experiment; the route was 24 miles long and the year's salary was \$300. Traveling by horseback was the first practical way of travel, with poor roads and occasionally a gate to be opened for a side trip. Various modes of transportation were used, till roads were improved, and the automobile came into general use.

Upon his retirement in October 1934, he had the distinction in point of service of being the oldest rural free delivery mail carrier in the United States. Mr. and Mrs. Gunning are connected with the Methodist church and are ever interested in the welfare of the community; many young people appreciate their assistance which was extended to them in their hour of need, educationally and otherwise.
