State Police Not Collection Agency

State police are highly desirous of cooperating with persons who are the victims of bad check artists, but if such persons themselves are unwilling to cooperate to the extent that the criminal statutes apply, then state officers cannot have any part in the business, Captain Walter Lansing of the state police told the Salem Credit association yesterday noon.

He pointed out that the principal duty of the officers is enforcement of criminal law, and that unless individuals are willing to lose their money in letting justice prevail upon those who pass bad checks, such action does not come within the criminal law, but is rather a civil law matter.

"It is not that our officers do not wish to assist you on collection of bad checks, but we are restrained by the law itself from doing so," Captain Lansing said.
