

Bearcats Defeat Prisoners Again

Burch Has Shutout in His Grasp When Impossible Bobble Perpetrated

Willamette's victorious baseball nine made it ten wins out of 11 games yesterday as it captured its second game from the Oregon state penitentiary Grays 6 to 1 on the prison diamond.

Don Burch, never defeated by the prison team in four years, hurled a masterful game and was headed for a shutout and a one-hit performance until the last inning when an occurrence so rare it was thought an impossibility came off.

The rare occurrence was Dwight Aden's miffing of a fly ball when two were out in the ninth inning. Aden's error put Meals on first and then J. Mason, prison catcher, singled to send him to second.

Keith Crosswhite, the pen pitcher, who was nicked for 11 blows by the Bearcats, saved the Grays from a shutout by singling to drive in Meals for the prison's lone run. Burch struck out Olson for the final out.

Scores Made Early Willamette's runs all came in the first three innings with infield trouble on the prisoner's team a helpful factor. The Bearcats got the jump in the first inning with three runs, two of them earned. Two more came across in the second, both unearned, and a third in the third, also unearned.

After the Grays juggled their infield in the fourth Willamette was unable to score and took only four hits off Crosswhite the rest of the game. Until the two hits in the ninth the only blow off Burch's delivery was a ground rule's double to the roof tops by Olson.

Kenneth Manning led the Willamette batters with three hits in three times at bat. Manning got to first every time he went to the plate, getting the base on balls twice.

Sluggers Sutton, Manning and Commons turned in doubles and Don Burch hit two for three.

Vinnie Harriman, regular shortstop, and Dick Weisberger, catcher, were back in the lineup after over a week's layoff.

The Bearcats will meet the University of Portland nine at Portland Monday and will open their conference schedule this weekend against Pacific.

year in reduced payroll, or a total economy of \$30,000, Van Patten estimates.

The manager's report in addition pointed out that "with the proposed gravity source of supply, with natural filtration at Stayton Island, it would be possible for the water commission to sell filtered water to large industries such as the paper mill and to state institutions, both in and out of the city, at a price which they could afford to pay, and this increase in revenue could be secured without any increase in production costs."

A minimum of five million gallons of water daily would safely be available for such sale should the gravity line delivering 16 million gallons each day be built, it is estimated.

Van Patten predicted that the water system development program, aside from laying of new mains within the city, would cost less than \$1,000,000.

"It is believed that the development of the natural infiltration system on Stayton Island will cost approximately \$50,000 less than the erection of the filtration plant estimated by the engineers and that all bids received in the future on labor and material . . . will be considerably less than the estimates as has been the case on bids received to date," Van Patten wrote.

"It is altogether probable that the total cost of all work originally estimated to cost \$1,150,000 will be well under \$1,000,000 if the natural infiltration system is developed on Stayton Island."

The quality of the island water, the manager points out, has been pronounced "class A" by the state board of health.

"It is our intention to completely fence that portion of Stayton Island which would be purchased by the city, thereby affording a completely protected source of water supply," the report adds.
