

Fall Campaign For Judge Due

McMahan Lacks 777 For Majority of Vote in Marion and Linn

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958 votes and C. S. "Pat" McMahan had 2365 votes to his credit. On the democratic ballot, Avery Thompson was nominated for district attorney with 5433 votes to 1804 received by B. S. Martin.

Heavy votes in Salem's precincts and the necessity of counting four different sets of ballots, slowed down the counting boards. It was 8:30 p. m. Saturday before the final reports had been received and computed at the office of the county clerk.

Hannah Martin is Just Edged Out. The republican nominees for representative were not determined until the final precinct had been tallied. Hannah Martin, incumbent, took fifth place in the voting and is out of the race, the closing checkup revealed, trailing Romeo Gouley, also an incumbent, by 53 votes. First on the legislative ticket for the republican nomination was Ronald E. Jones with 8775 votes, George Duncan of Stuyves, a newcomer in the legislative fight coming in second with 7452. Walter Fuhrer, incumbent, who led the ticket two years ago, took third in the race with 7333 votes. Fuhrer was unable to participate in the closing days of the campaign, being seriously ill in a local hospital.

On the democratic ticket for legislature first on the ticket was J. P. Ulrich, who led his colleagues having taken first honors with an aggregate vote of 2836. H. M. Potter of Silverton came second with 2272 votes, S. B. Mills of Salem, third, with 2592 votes and T. A. Liversley of Salem fourth with 2545.

Roy Meland had been nominated on the republican ticket for county commissioner by a margin of 748 votes over H. Elmer King, the complete returns revealed. J. S. Coomer came in third in the race.

On the democratic ticket, David C. Bloom was first in the commissioner's race, with a lead of 538 over Perry W. Seely. McGilchrist in as Sheriff Nominee.

Final reports bore out the preliminary counts in showing that James McGilchrist had received the republican nomination for sheriff with Warren "Dick" Richardson the runnerup. A. C. Burk had been renominated on the democratic ticket with Curtis Coleman 757 votes behind.

To U. G. Boyer went honors for outdistancing all his colleagues at the courthouse in the number of votes received, Boyer's friends giving him 7879 votes to 3249 cast for William Bliven who in his contest for the republican nomination for county clerk made his first political campaign in the county.

Dave G. Drager won handily the republican nomination for treasurer although R. C. Churchill piled up 4627 votes.

The republican race for county surveyor, which means election since no democrat stood for the position, saw Hugh Fisher with 5621 votes defeat W. J. Knox who received a total of 4,583 ballots in his favor.
