

### Last Concrete Poured, Mill

Completion Will Be Rushed For Company at Scio; Reservoir Ready

SCIO, May 21.—Final concrete was poured Wednesday for floors and walls in the foundation of the new Scio Mill & Elevator company building on the southeast corner of Main and Mill streets in Scio.

Completion of the buildings, to have galvanized brick siding, and corrugated iron roofs, is expected to begin immediately. The warehouse and office, facing Main street, will be 40 feet wide and 14 1/2 feet long and will join the mill building, to be 40 by 50 feet, on the east.

The warehouse will be a one-story building with a 12-foot ceiling. The mill building will have a nine-foot basement, a 14-foot first or working floor and a 16-foot upper floor, according to J. D. Densmore, sr., Scio manager of the company.

The basement and foundations are of concrete, approximately 200 yards being used in the construction work.

A loading platform will run the entire length of the two buildings, 195 1/2 feet, on the Mill street frontage. Water power will generate from three Samson turbines set in a penstock at the west end of the forebay, tapping the reservoir. The turbines will develop 140 horsepower under full head. The reservoir was dug last fall to guard against shortage of water in the dry season.

J. H. Blockley, Portland, is in charge of surveying and construction for the project. The Zuber Construction company, Portland, furnished concrete work, using a power cement mixer. Fourteen laborers, most of whom are local men, are employed in the work.
