

Prison Survey Is Authorized

Industrial Expansion to Eliminate Idleness Is Urged, Federal Man

Federal survey of the Oregon state prison with a view of expanding its industries and improving the condition of the convicts, was authorized at a conference here Thursday attended by Governor Martin, James P. Davis, director of the federal prisons industries board, and others interested in the welfare of the penal institution.

Seven outstanding suggestions were made by Davis, as follows:

Establishment of a receiving and classification unit in the prison.

Education program to be made available to all prisoners.

Industrial expansion so as to eliminate idleness.

Larger farms for production of useful crops.

Adequate supervision for paroled convicts.

Close investigation of convicts prior to their parole.

Won't Interfere

Davis made it plain that the federal government would not actually direct any industrial expansion or other reforms but merely would make recommendations. He said in many states convicts had been used on the highways to good advantage.

Warden Lewis of the Oregon prison said an attempt was once made to use convicts on highway construction here but the plan was abandoned because of the grief that resulted.

Davis also declared that in some states stress was placed on the parole of first-offenders, who could be trusted, with a view of reducing state costs.

Governor Martin replied that convicts sent to the Oregon prison could not expect misuse of the parole power.

"I believe in certain and substantial punishment for persons who violate the laws", Governor Martin said.

Tax Limit Bill's Title Is Written

Ballot title for the proposed constitutional amendment to limit and reduce the total permissible state tax on real and tangible personal property in 1937 to six mills per dollar of assessed valuation, was completed by Attorney General Van Winkle today.

The reduction would continue until 1942 when a base of 4.8 mills would be reached.

In event the petitions are completed by July 1 the amendment will go on the ballot at the November election.
