Proves False

Bull Gesture

Utilities Lead in Early Advance, Retracted at Close of Session

NEW YORK, May 21 .- (P)-Stocks made another motion toward recovery in today's market, but it turned out to be a false one so far as most of the leaders were concerned.

The utilities, buoyed by pleasing earnings statements and hopes for better treatment by congress, stepped into the front ranks in the morning. 
