Experiment Station in Holland Asks For Parkersville Corn After Trials With Iowa Variety Are Unsuccessful

PARKERSVILLE, May 27.—C. M. Van Zuylen received a request from A. C. Koopman in care of the government experiment station at Zealand in Holland for seed corn from this district. They had tried Iowa corn, which grew from 14 to 16 feet high but did not mature. Since some parts of Holland have about the same climate as the Willamette valley they have hopes of getting this to mature. The four varieties, yellow dent, white dent, flint and squaw corn were sent two pounds of each. The postage for this amount was \$1.86. If this matures a premium will be given by Mr. Van Zuylen. So far the corn crop there is just for green feed. Here about eight pounds of corn is planted to the acre, there 50 to 60 pounds to acre in rows about 12 inches apart and all hand cultivated.
