Clemency Denied To Robert Green

Governor Martin has denied executive clemency to Robert Green, who is serving a life term in the state penitentiary for the murder of Caleb Green in Coos county. The men were not relatives.

Robert Green was convicted of the crime early in 1928 and was received at the penitentiary March 15 of that year. The state supreme court later reversed the conviction on the ground that Green's confession was not admissible in evidence. Green subsequently was retried, convicted and again was received at the prison March 29, 1929.

Application for a pardon was filed by Peck and King, Marshfield attorneys. A similar application previously was denied by ex-Governor Meier.

L. H. Meyer Undergoes Operation to Remove Tumor from Shoulder

SILVERTON, May 28.—L. H. Meyer, who has been at the Silvertown hospital since January 25 with a broken leg, submitted to an operation Thursday morning for the removal of a tumor from his shoulder. Mr. Meyer will be confined to bed again for a few days.

Because all of his weight will have to be carried on his one leg when he again walks, Mr. Meyer is being kept at the hospital until July. He lost his other leg in an accident when a young boy.
