Mary A. Crawley Dies in Nebraska

UNIONVALE, June 11.—Mrs. Mary Ann Crawley, 86, one of the last Civil war widows of Burdard, Neb., and mother of Mrs. Clarence L. Fowler and Ivan L. Crawley of Unionvale, died at her home June 9, according to a telegram received here Tuesday, after illness of nine days. However she was up and around in her home each day.

She was born July 25, 1849 in Ohio and came overland in a covered wagon with a brother to Pawnee county, Neb., where she had resided since. She knew the hardships of pioneering. She celebrated her golden wedding six months before her husband's death which occurred May 24, 1922. She was the last one of a family of 12 children. She was all her life a member of the United Presbyterian church and the last charter member of the group which organized at Burdard in 1882.

Besides the two children at Unionvale she is survived by one son and three daughters who have lived less than four miles from her all their lives. Funeral services and burial was at Burdard.

Recipe for perfect STRAWBERRY JAM

4 cups (2 pounds) prepared fruit
7 cups (3 pounds) sugar
1/4 bottle Certo
