Bonus and Relief Issues Clarified

Status Same as Any Other Clients Who Receive Funds, Stated

The Marion county relief administration's attitude toward needy war veterans who last week received bonus bonds is governed entirely by a resolution passed by the state relief committee last February 27, according to C. Miles, county administrator. The resolution, of which Miles received a copy this month, provides that "bonds, moneys, or other property received by veterans from their adjusted service certificates shall be treated as if they are other resources when eligibility for relief is being considered."

Miles said he was bound by the resolution to decide whether or not indigent assistance was to be stopped, in the case of veterans receiving the bonus, entirely on the basis of their financial condition.

No Discrimination
The resolution read as follows: "Whereas, Mr. Martin C. Day, legislative chairman, Veterans of Foreign Wars, in his letter dated February 6, 1936, requested a ruling from the state relief committee relative to veterans who receive bonds or other funds from adjusted service certificates, and whereas, Chapter 3, Title LXVII, Oregon Code, 1930, (soldiers and sailors aid), provides for assisting indigent veterans directly by the county courts of the state:

"Now therefore, be it resolved, that relief shall be provided for those destitute veterans who can not qualify or are not served under Chapter 3, Title LXVII, Oregon Code, 1930, on the same basis as other needy persons; and "Be it further resolved, that bonds, moneys, or other property received by veterans from their adjusted service certificates shall be treated the same as other resources when eligibility for relief is being considered."

Shaw Takes Over Santa Clara Job
SAN JOSE, Calif., June 20.—(AP)—Paul R. Kately, who resigned as head football coach at the University of Santa Clara, and Lawrence "Buck" Shaw, his assistant, today was named his successor. Shaw, under whose regime Santa Clara developed as one of the leading football aggregations of the country, resigned last night to go to Villanova college as head football coach, a post vacant since Harry Stuhldreher moved to University of Wisconsin. Shaw was brought to Santa Clara in 1929 as assistant coach. Previously he had coached at Nevada and North Carolina.
