# Husky Varsity Oarsmen Make Sweep of Hudson River Regatta

## Feat Last Done 24 Years Ago

California Second and Navy Third in 8-Oar Competition

REGATTA COURSE, Poughkeepsie, N. Y., June 22 .- (AP)-The Washington varsity crew completed the first clean sweep made in the intercollegiate regatta on the Hudson river since 1912 tonight when it swept to a length and a half victory over California. Navy took third, Columbia was fourth, Cornell fifth, Pennsylvania sixth and Syracuse trailed in the main event of the regatta. Margin is 3.8 Seconds

The official margin separating the two western crews was three and four-fifths seconds. Washington was clocked in 19 minutes 9 3/5 seconds, California in 19:13 2/5. Due mainly to the slow early pace, the time was considerably off the record of 18:35 4/5, set by California's 1928 champions under conditions that were scarcely any more favorable than today's. The Washington oarsmen

opened the competition by registering a length victory over California in the freshman race and the Huskies junior varsity crew paddled down a three-mile course to defeat the Navy's jayvees by almost three lengths.

Not since 1912, when Cornell registered three victories in a regatta that had junior varsity four-oared shells racing instead of eights, has a college made a clean sweep.

The Washington varsity trailed most of the way during the fourmile race, which saw California and Navy battling for the lead during most of the middle stages. The Huskies did not make their bid until they paddled into the last half mile where they uncorked a magnificent drive.

The Huskies' winning time was slow in being posted. The midshipmen's plebes trailed the California youngsters by two and a half lengths as they finished in third place in the two-mile opening race, with Cornell fourth, Syracuse fifth and Columbia sixth


#### Ulbrickson, Coach Now, Stroked Crew To Win Decade Ago
