

France Continues Conscription Plan

Wants to Keep Army Up to Top Strength; Bastille Day Trouble Feared

PARIS, July 1.—(AP)—The French government, bent on keeping its army at top strength in troubled Europe, announced tonight it would retain provisions for two-year conscript service. Edouard Daladier, the minister for national defense, told the army committee of the chamber of deputies any shortening of the length of military service was "out of the question."

Early in 1935 the term of con-

scription was doubled to span the period when Frenchmen born in the World War's lean years were called to the colors. Daladier, however, said the army would be "democratized." This was taken as an indication he might try to reduce the bridge of class distinction between officers and men, without endangering discipline. Minor Issues Ahead Premier Leon Blum's government, holding a new vote of confidence on its action in suppressing rightist leagues, faced but minor parliamentary hurdles before the chamber goes on vacation late in July. However, Bastille day, the national holiday July 14, was awaited with anxiety because of the possibility of a rightist counter-demonstration to leftist festivities.

Mexican Highway Opens to Traffic

LAREDO, Tex., July 1.—(AP)—The nine-year-old dream of Mexican officials—the Pan-American highway—came true today as the \$17,000,000 thoroughfare was opened to traffic with Vice-President Garner and Mexican dignitaries joining hands in an international expression of friendship.

The highway, linking the Texas border with Mexico's scenic interior, was officially opened with impressive ceremony. In Washington President Roosevelt congratulated the Mexican people "on the auspicious occasion of the opening of the Mexico City-Nuevo Laredo highway."

The ruddy vice-president, whose Uvalde home is not far from the first mile of the highway said "A great link has been forged in the chain uniting the in friendliness these two republics."

The Pan-American highway extends from Canada to the Mexican capital, Mexico City, but in time will be built through Central America to the Argentine in South America, completing a 12,000-mile unit.
