

Cowboys Take Over Molalla for Annual Buckaroo Celebration

Events Open There Today

Clay Carr Back to Try to Hold Honors of Last Year

MOLALLA, July 2.—Tall gentlemen wearing black sombreros are making the sidewalks of Molalla ring with the clink of their boots this week. They are cowboys—champion bronc riders, bull-doggers, bareback riders and calf ropers of the west—who are swarming into Molalla early to take part in the 13th annual Buckaroo that starts Friday and lasts July 4 and 5. Never before have the streets of Molalla been so alive with cowboys before the Buckaroo. This is just one of the indications that point to an unusually successful show this year.

Down at the Buckaroo grounds, where everything is shipshape for the big show to start, Buckaroo directors are pointing with pride to the corrals of wild Brahmas and Texas longhorn steers. These steers were hand-picked and they are as tough as any cowboy has ever wrestled with. Wild horses and prize buckers are also quartered on the grounds. Cowboys took wild rides on some of the buckers Sunday. One of the hardest buckers is Zane Grey, which, like most of the other broncos, has never been ridden.

Champions on Hand
Clay Carr, who tied here last year for the honor of being the most outstanding cowboy, has wired the Buckaroo officers to enter him in the events. Carr is "tops" among all-around cowboys.

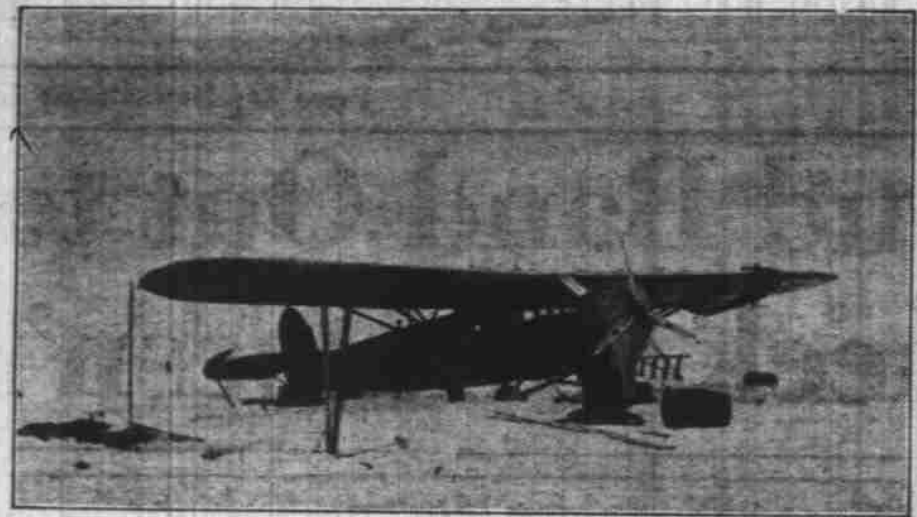

Guild Elected To School Job

But Chairman Refuses to Swear Him in After Vote Counted

INDEPENDENCE, July 2.—At a special meeting of the Independence school board called by Chairman W. T. Hoffman Monday night to elect a director to serve a one year term left vacant by J. E. Kelley, resigned, Valen Guild received 34 votes and E. A. Dunckel, 46.

Guild was not sworn in as director by Hoffman. The chairman stated before the voting started that the school law read that no person who was not on the last tax roll would be eligible for the office. E. A. Weddle challenged this statement, stating that an amendment had been made to this law since the last printing of the regular school law. His information, he stated, was from Bruce Spaulding, district attorney and L. H. Van Winkle, attorney general. Hoffman said he would not swear in a director who did not meet this tax roll requirement and if they wished his resignation he would hand it in. Guild stated he was paying taxes in Polk county under his mother's name, who had willed the residence he resides in to him.

Investigate Further
Dean Walker made a motion that the board look into the matter and see if the law had been amended before any action was taken. During the hour which the meeting was held open, the discussion of what to do with the present high school was brought up by William Campbell and Dean Walker.

Talks seem to run into two trends: to add a wing to the present plant and a new heating system with plans of finally in the future to complete a new building by adding to the wing, and the possibility of a union high school joining with Monmouth. No action was taken although the chairman stated that something must be done in the way of repairs and a new heating plant before school opened in the fall.
